of his for the preservation of Church rights and
charitable bequests in trust to my heir, I hereby make
my Last Will & Testament - After discharging my
financial expenses, and my personal debts, I bequeath
to the Rt. Arch. Bishop of Baltimore Francis Patrick
Remick in trust for my executor, who shall be
regularly appointed by the Supreme Pontiff the Pope
of the See of Rome. all the property of which I
may be possessed or may have been conveyed to
myself, Bishop of Savannah, or entrusted to me
or my charitable churches, upon the following obligating
viz. saying Miss Elizabeth Custard of Philadelphia
and hundred dollars annually during her natural
life according to Bishop Sartorius Will - To James
an annual Map distributed for the relief of the
late Edward Linn now a resident of Augusta Ga
and a benefactor of the Church there - The faithfully
carrying out all the provisions and obligations of
Wills & Hereditaments in my favor - Of my assets
viz. certificates and Bonds in my possession of 30
Shares in the Hamburg Bank S C and Bonds of
The Council of Augusta Ga of \$2000 dollars and
Bonds of the State of Georgia 1000 dollars and
Bonds of City of Savannah 1000, these 3000 \$ Bonds
are in the safe of Merchants & Planters Bank. Of
these assets, I wish that two thousand be expended
in the Establishment of the Brothers of Christian
Instruction, or some other Brotherly of a like
character in the City of Augusta Ga \$2000 for the
said Establishment - in this City - the remaining sum
of three assets, I wish to be expended on the
Building of a Male Catholic Asylum for Boys
in this City - All other property which may be found
to be mine, I hereby bequeath to the said Arch Bishop
to be given to my executor for the good of Religion
in this Diocese - I hereby constitute and appoint
my Rector William of Savannah the Executor of
this my Last Will

Then Second. I give devise and bequeath unto the Trustees
hereinafter named and appointed the Eastern Half of
Lot Number Eighteen (18) Green Ward fronting on President
Street with the improvements: also the Eastern Half of Lot
Number Thirty (30) Columbia Ward fronting on York Street
with the improvements: also the interest in Forty Shores
(40) of the Study of the Central Rail Road and Banking
Company of Georgia. Also my Negro Woman 'Sauce'
with whatever articles forming my 'House hold and
Kitchen Furniture. My Wife may see fit and prefer to
select for her own use, and also such of my 'Silver -
Ware' as is in daily use. In trust for the sole use and
 behoof of my beloved Wife Eliza Hunt, and for her
Maintenance and Support, and during her natural
life, and from and after her decease, then in Trust
to divide the same equally - between my nine children
or their lawful representatives - To-wit: I give to my
daughters Margaret & Ferguson, Eliza B. Dwyer, Frances
McNeil, Ann Maria B. Dwyer and Hannah Hunt
my immovable estate, the business of my Silver
Ware, such as Chrome, Bone, Ladles, butter Knives and c.
to be equally divided between them for their own use and
enjoyment with any condition or trust, then I give
I give devise and bequeath unto the Trustees hereinafter
named, and appointed, Lot Number Twenty (20) Columbia
Ward with the improvements, having a front on President
Street, In Trust for the sole use and behoof of my daughter
Margaret & Ferguson during her natural life and after
her decease, in Trust to convey the same to such of her
nine or their lawful representatives (that is her children or
grand children) as may then be in life and share
alike in fee. Then Fifth. I give devise and bequeath
unto the Trustees hereinafter named and appointed, Lot
Number Thirty Two (32) Green Ward, fronting on Vice Street
and York Street. With the improvements thereon, and then
in Trust for the sole use and behoof of my daughter Eliza
B. Dwyer during her natural life, and after her decease
in Trust to convey the same to such of her children
or their lawful representatives as may then be in life
share and share alike, in fee. Then Sixth. I give
devise and bequeath unto the Trustees hereinafter named
and appointed, Lot Number Five (5) Third Street
Anson Ward, fronting on York and Drayton Streets with
the improvements thereon: In Trust for the sole use and
 behoof of my daughter Frances McNeil during her
natural life, and after her decease in Trust to convey
the same to such of her children or their lawful representatives
as may then be in life share and share alike in fee
Then Seventh. I give devise and
bequeath unto the Trustees hereinafter named and

appointed, Lot Number One (1) Market Ward, fronting
on St James Square. In Trust to divide the same equally
between my daughter Ann Maria Benty and Mary
Schauff, and to hold One Half thereof with the improvements
in Trust for the sole use and behoof of my daughter
Ann Maria Benty during her natural life; and
after her decease in Trust to convey the same to such
of her children, or their lineal representatives as may
then be in life, share and share alike in fee; and as
to the other half remaining half, with the improvements
to hold the same in Trust for the sole use and behoof
of my daughter Mary Schauff during her natural
life and in case she should marry hereafter, then in
Trust to convey the same to such of her children the
issue of such marriage (after her decease) or their lineal
representatives as may then be in life, share and share
alike in fee. But should my daughter the said Mary
Schauff contract no marriage, or having intermarried
die without leaving any issue or having left such issue
should they die before they should have entered into poss-
ession, I then personally or by their Guardian, then
my and after the decease of my said daughter
Mary Schauff in Trust to distribute the same equally
between such of my children or their lineal representatives
as may then be in life equally and share and share
alike in fee. Item Eighth, I give devise and bequeath
unto my son John Schauff, Lot Number Twenty Nine
(29) and Thirty (30) Columbia Ward, with the improvements
thereon lying and being, so have and to hold the said
lot with the improvements unto him and his heirs and
assigns forever in fee simple absolute. Item Ninth
I give devise and bequeath unto my son James Schauff
Lot Number Eleven (11) Green Ward being the premises
whereon I now reside with the improvements; also Lot
Number ten (10) Carpenter Row fronting on East Broad Street
with the improvements thereon lying and being, so have
and to hold the same, with the improvements unto
him and his heirs and assigns forever in fee simple
absolute. Item Tenth, I give devise and bequeath unto
my son Andrew Schauff, Lot Number four (4) third
Sticking Anderson Ward, fronting on York Street with the
improvements thereon lying and being, so have and
to hold the same with the improvements unto him the
said Andrew Schauff and his heirs and assigns forever
in fee simple. Item Eleventh, I give devise and
bequeath unto the trustees hereinafter named and
appointed, Lot Number twenty three (23) and twenty
four (24) Green Ward fronting on Green Square and
Resident Street, with the improvements thereon lying
and being. Item Twelfth, I give devise and bequeath unto

distributed as follows, and the property I contemplate it
them to operate on is as follows. Lot and improvements
number fifteen (15) Carpenters Row. Half lot and im-
provements ^{number four (4) Bayview Road: Lot and improvements (1)} number thirteen (13) Brown Road, Lot and im-
provements number fourteen (14) Brown
Road, Lot number twenty five (25) New Leeds Ogles-
thorpe Road: and lots numbers nine (9) and thirty
four (34) Cranford Road. With whatever money, I may
have in my house or deposited in any Bank
to my credit at the time of my decease, I order
and desire my Executors to divide the above property
into nine equal shares, or portions, and for that purpose
I appoint them arbitrators, and having divided the
same as above requested, I desire them to convey
to each of my children one share each of the amount
they divided and falling to them. With the understanding
that the shares falling to my daughter above named
be held by the trustees hereinafter named and appointed
upon the uses and purposes hereafter named, is attaching
to each of their shares, and the shares falling to my
sons I give to them absolutely. Item Thirteenth. I order
and direct that my Central Rail Road and Banking
Company Stock amounting at present to thirty six shares
also twenty six shares South Western Rail Road
Stock, also three shares Marine Bank, also ten shares
in Calicut Stock of the Savannah Albany and
Buff Road Company, and all other stocks. I may
hereafter become possessed of with my Negro slaves
Tracy and her two children Rebecca and Elizabeth, Charlotte
and her two children Jane and William, Oscar, Josephine
and Lucy, whom I desire retained in the family. I desire
divided equally among my children or their legal repre-
sentatives as provided, and upon the understanding set
forth in the Twelfth item of this my Last Will and
Testament, and upon none other. Item Fourteenth. I
desire and direct that my man Edmund (if alive
at the time of my death) also the following lands
to wit. Two (2) tracts of Land containing each
two hundred and fifty acres and half acres situated

in the Seventh and Eighth districts of Madison
County in this State, Seven hundred and thirty
acres of land owned by me and lying in
Effingham County in this State, and also about
thundred and fifty acres of land lying in
Bryson County in this State, and owned by me
be sold by my Executors as soon after my
decease as convenient and the proceeds arising
therefrom I desire invested for the benefit of my
Estate, and appropriated as I have directed in
the twelfth Item of this my Last Will and
Testament, Item fifteenth, I desire and direct
that all and singular whatever property or
Estate of a Personal Nature, I may be possessed
of or entitled to at the time of my death, not
heretofore mentioned or embraced, that the same
be subject to the provisions and divided under
the twelfth Item of this my Will. Item Sixteenth
I appoint my sons John L Haupt, Andrew L
Haupt and James L Haupt, Testamentary
trustees of my Grand daughter Jane H Beck
my Wife Eliza Haupt and my daughters Margaret
S Ferguson, Eliza B Seyle, Francis M Wall Ann
Maria R Dance and Mary L Haupt and my
daughter in law Elizabeth Haupt Wife of my
deceased son Samuel B Haupt and Guardian
of their Children should either of them depart this
life leaving Minor Children, her or them leaving

Item Seventeenth - I order and direct
that no disposition of my Estate or distribution of any
part thereof, shall take place until twelve months
after my decease; excepting however that the portion
given to my Wife Eliza Haupt, which I will and
desire shall be given to her within ten days
after my death, Item Eighteenth, I nominate
Constitute and appoint my sons John L Haupt
Andrew L Haupt and James L Haupt, Execu-
tors of this my Last Will and Testament.
