all others by me at any time made.

After the payment of all my just and lawful debts, I give and
bequeath unto my beloved wife Catharine Elizabeth Parthelmess, all
my estate, personal or real, that I may die possessed of,
whether real, personal or mixed, of whatever name or nature, to
her sole use, benefit and behoof, so long as she shall remain my
widow, and at her death, to be equally divided, share and share
alike, between each of my children as may be living at the time
of her death, and should any of my children depart this life
during the lifetime of my said wife having lawful issue, then
and in that case the said issue shall be entitled to the share of
my Estate herein devised, that would have belonged to the parent of
said issue had said parent been living at the time of the death of
my said wife.

Provided nevertheless that if my said wife
Catharine E. Parthelmess should marry during her widowhood, then
and in that case I hereby direct that my Estate herein before
devised, shall be equally divided, share and share alike,
between my said wife and my children as may be living at the time of her death.

between my said wife Catharine E. and each of my children
as may be living at the time of the said marriage and the lawful
issue of such as may have departed this life previous to said mar-
riage.

Lastly-

Constitute and appoint my said wife Catharine E. (Barthel-
-my's Executrix and my son Robert M. Barthelmey's Executor of this
my last Will and Testament.
