Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said beloved wife Ann Daily, sole executrix of this my Last will & Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time before made - In testimony whereof I the said John Daily have hereunto set my hand & seal at Savannah this fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty six
