I, Harriet C. Campbell, of the City of Savannah, but heretofore
provisionally abiding in the City of Augusta, being in feeble health
but of sound and disposing mind and memory, revoking
all former wills made by me, do now make, ordain and publish
this present writing as and for my last Will and Testament,
in manner following: that is to say

First. To my Nephew Edward C. Campbell. I give bequeath and
devise my Lot and Dwelling house in the City of Savannah
with all and singular the rights, members, privileges and ac-
companiments thereof, and all and singular the household
and kitchen furniture in and about the same, or property
belonging thereto, excepting the bedsteads and bedding; with
this reservation however, that my Nephew George Jones
shall have the possession, use and enjoyment of the said Lot
Dwelling and appurtenances from the time of my decease
until the end of one year after the termination of the civil
war between the Confederate States and the United States of
America, without the payment of rent or other compensation
therefor to my Executors or the Devisee thereof, named in
my Will; I also give and bequeath in my said Nephew
Edward C. Campbell all the plate, China and Glass ware
therein or hereunto appertaining thereto, excepting only
such parts thereof as I may hereinafter otherwise dispose
of; and also all the stock now owned by me in any in-
corporated Bank, Rail Road, Banking, or other joint stock
Company excepting only such parts and so much thereof
as I may hereinafter give and bequeath to other persons.

Second. To my Nephew, the said George Jones, I give &
bequeath twenty (20) Shares of the Capital Stock of the
Central Rail Road and Banking Company; ten (10) Shares
of that of the Marine Bank, ten (10) of the Bank of the
State of Georgia, and ten (10) of the Merchants and Planters
Bank in the City of Savannah, and my share of the pew
in Christ Church, now owned by us in common; also the

following Slaves: to wit: Moore, John and James (grown men);
Anthony, Andrew, Joseph, Moore, Charles, Julius, John and
Henry (Boys); Rose, Agnes, Thiscilla, Jane, Janie, Hannah and
Kate, (grown women) and Agnes, Lucinda, Mariann, Agnes, Rosa
and Elizabeth (girls) - and the future increase of the female.
Third In my niece Mary J. Newville, widow of the Rev. Edward
Newville, I give and bequeath ten (10) shares of the Capital Stock
of the Bank of the State of Georgia.

In my Nephew Phineas Miller Kellock ten (10) shares of the same.
In his wife Sarah Hill Kellock ten (10) other shares of the same;
In Sarah Fenwick ^{Wife} ten (10) other shares of the same; - and
In my Nephew George Jones Kellock ten (10) other shares of the said
Capital Stock of the Bank of the State of Georgia.

Fourth. In my niece Sarah Fenwick Gardner I give and
bequeath twenty (20) shares of the Capital Stock of the Central
Rail Road & Banking Company, and ten (10) shares of the
Capital Stock of the Merchants & Planters' Bank; also my
dearest set of silver knives and forks; the (3) silver tasses; three
(3) silver waiters; Secretary and the small chain in my
Drawing Room.

In my Niece Mary E. Harrison twenty shares of the said
Capital Stock of the Central Rail Road & Banking Com-
pany and ten (10) shares of the capital stock of the said
"Merchants and Planters" Bank; also a Silver Coffee Pot,
tea Pot (unmarked) sugar Dish, milk Pot and Cream Jug;
also the locked Clockwork which is or was, in my Drawing
Room.

Fifth: In my said Nieces Sarah Fenwick Gardner & Mary
E. Harrison I give and bequeath all my bed & table linen.

Sixth In my Niece Maria H. Montgomery I give and bequeath
twenty shares of the Capital Stock of the Bank of the State
of Georgia; two dozen large silver forks and two dozen large
silver spoons.

In my Nephew George T. Jones (son of George Jones) twenty
(20) shares of the Capital Stock of the Merchants & Planters'
Bank, in the City of Savannah; the likeness of his Father;
a set of Castors and Ice Cream spoon.

In my Nephew William H. Harrison Five Hundred dollars worth
of City of Savannah Stock of Augusta and Waynesborough
"Companies."

In my Niece Sally C. Jones one Cake Basket, Cordial Stand
and bottles and a Silver Salver.

In my Nephew Morley Harrison one dozen dessert forks &

In my Nephew Noble Harrison one pair of ^{silver} candle sticks and
Fish Knife.

Seventh In my Nephew George Jones (hereinafter made
Residuary Legatee) I give and bequeath in addition to what
is heretofore given to him, all the Ready money and Bank
Bills which at the time of my decease I may have about

me or on deposits in Bank or elsewhere: also all interest now due and payable or which may before the fifteenth day of August next (1862) become due and payable on any corporation or other Bonds, which I may hold at the time of my decease, and also all Bank Dividends on any stock held by me, including not only any Dividends already declared and not "drawn" but all dividends which may be declared before the said fifteenth day of August next (1862) with the understanding and in confidence that he will dispose of the same and whatever more he may receive as Residuary Legatee - in the payment of all just demands against me and my Estate, and as to whatever may remain thereof in such manner as I have already requested or may hereafter request of him.

Eighth I give and bequeath all the Rest and Residue of my Estate whereever situated, and of whatever consisting -

Ninth I nominate, constitute and appoint my nephews George Jones and Edward F Campbell, Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, written on this and the three preceding pages.

In testimony whereof I, the said Harriet I Campbell have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and Sixty two.
