O'Neal (the Pastor of the Catholic Church of Savannah) Trustee nevertheless his heirs, assigns, executors & administrators and each and their heirs, assigns, executors, Administrators the remainder of my property to divide in the manner following

First: I give devise and bequeath unto my Friend — Rich^d. C. Johnston of Wicklow County Ireland the sum of Thirteen £s Sterling and my friend Elizabeth Nowlan of the same place the sum of Two £s. Sterling to be paid as soon as the Trustee receives the same.

Second: I give devise and bequeath unto my brother Arthur O'Neal one half of the balance of my property my Brother now living in Wicklow Ireland the to receive his proportion whenever the Trustee deems it prudent and to best advantage.

Thirdly: I give devise and bequeath unto my sister Sarah Brown now in Wicklow County Ireland and my Nephew John & my niece Margaret, children of my brother Henry O'Neal of the City of Dublin Ireland the balance of my estate share and share alike to be equally divided by the Trustee as soon as he deems it to the best advantage.

Lastly: I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my Friends Mich^l. Prendergast, John J. Waver and Matthew Hopkins executors of this my Last Will and Testament.
