Parsons & Son & stay endorsed by mortgage on house in Cum Town on South half of Lot No 25 on Wayne Street, other arrangements will have to be made which I cannot think of at this time

As I am not directly interested in any other property it being in trust to Aaron Champion & Louis N. Halligan for my wife I will be unable to give any direction as the contract is not in any wise invested in me - its income can pay all its expenses

The object of this paper and its future use to be made in case of my death, being about leaving this City for Havana for my health and I now leave my wife Mrs. S. S. Cooper and her brother John G. Halligan my legal representatives and in case of disability to John G. to get advice and assistance of Joseph C. Halligan both of whom will cheerfully attend to the same
