and to have a metal brick vault built therein, in which I direct

The rest and remainder of the money which may be left from
the sale of my property after the expenses hereinbefore mentioned
and paid, I direct that it shall be equally divided between
my son Samuel G. Lester and "The Independent Presbyterian
Church of Savannah" share and share alike.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint, Revd J. B. H. Axson
and John Stoddard of the City of Savannah, Executors of this my
last Will and Testament.
