This is the last Will and  
Testament of Mary Anna Cooper of the City of Savannah  
in the County of Chatham and State of Georgia spinner  
I Mary Anna Cooper, being in health of body & of sound &  
disposing mind and memory, commending my soul at death  
to God, who gave it, in the hope of a happy resurrection  
through the atonement and mediation of our Saviour Lord and  
Savior Jesus Christ - Do make publish and declare this to be  
my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all and every  
other will or Wills heretofore by me made, in manner and  
form following that is to say - 1<sup>st</sup> I desire that all my just  
debts be paid by my executors hereinafter named, as soon  
after my decease as can be conveniently done 2<sup>nd</sup> I give  
herein and bequeath the sum of One Thousand Dollars

for the benefit of Seamen during their time of service  
The sum to be paid by way of certain dividends to be paid  
in such way and manner as in their judgment  
will most conduce to the benefit of said Seamen paying  
said sum of Four thousand dollars over to such Society  
or Societies as they may select for the purpose of building  
or aiding or building a Sailor's Home or Homes or for  
any other purpose, or investing the sum in good and  
sufficient securities and paying the annual dividends  
or interest derived therefrom as a salary to a Seaman-  
preacher or in any other way which they may consider  
most conducive to the end in view 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath  
certain to William and Robert Mackay and their heirs  
forever all that Lot of Land in the City of Savannah  
known as Lot No one, Second tything Reynolds Ward &  
the improvements thereon as tenants in common and not  
as joint tenants to them the said William & Robert  
Mackay and their heirs forever - which Lot was obtained  
by my grand father, when that part of the town was  
laid off, he having come over to this country in company  
with Gen Oglethorpe on his second Voyage and  
said Lot has since his death remained in possession of  
his descendants 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to Catherine  
and Sarah Mackay the two unmarried daughters  
of Mrs Eliza Mackay, all that Island known as Oatland  
Island, situated in Chatham County State of Georgia  
with all its appurtenances of Hammocky and Marshy  
soe and also all my Cattle and Stock of every kind  
on the said Island being at the time of my death to  
them the said Catherine and Sarah as tenants in common  
and not as joint tenants, equally to be divided between  
them to them respectively and their heirs forever to  
their sole and separate use and not subject to the  
debt, contracts or covenants of my future husband, and  
in case of the marriage of either the said Catherine  
or Sarah Mackay I direct that this property be held  
in trust for their sole and separate use - 5<sup>th</sup> I give and  
bequeath to Mrs Mary Anna Stiles, wife of Benjamin  
Edward Stiles all my plantation slaves lying and  
being in Housto County in the State of Georgia together  
with all the Stock and appurtenances of my kind  
(excepting negroes) that may be on said Plantation  
at the time of my death, and excepting the crop then  
growing or gathered, which crop is to be sold and the  
amount received therefrom to be invested in money  
and the negroes belonging to said plantation to  
remain on the same to work out the time agreed  
sent to Market, to have power to sell the said  
Plantation Stock and appurtenances to the best  
Meeting Owners Stiles

and subject in any manner to the debts Contracts or Contests  
of her husband or any future husband - I also give and  
bequeath to the said Mary Anna Stiles all that half Lot of  
Land in the City of Savannah known as the Western half  
of Lot No 6<sup>th</sup> Block by the name of Ward with all the  
improvements on the same to have and to hold the said  
half lot to her the said Mary Anna Stiles for her sole  
and separate use (as above) not subject in any man-  
ner to the debts Contracts or Contests of her present or any  
future husband, and after the death of the said Mary  
Anna Stiles, I give and bequeath the said Plantation  
in Houston County and said half Lot of Land in the  
City of Savannah up to the children of said Mary Anna  
Stiles in such form and manner and to such individ-  
uals as she may designate by Will - 6<sup>th</sup> The following  
negro Slaves I desire shall be sold by my executors for the  
benefit of my Estate - Namely Young Jack (Carpenter)  
Mulatto George (Carpenter), Harriet and her daughter  
Precilla and daughter Lazarine and Lazarine's husband  
Smart and their children now seven in Number and  
Olivia - Giving them and each of them the privilege  
of selecting a master, and when they shall have been  
sold, each grown person shall receive from my execu-  
tors the sum of fifty dollars, and ten dollars shall be  
spent or used for the benefit of each child so sold  
And when Olivia shall have been sold I desire that  
besides the fifty dollars paid to himself, the sum  
of fifty dollars shall also be paid by my executors  
to his mother Sophy - And I further desire that if  
any Occasion shall arise making it necessary for either  
of my heirs to sell any negro or negroes bequeathed by  
me, that in such case each grown person sold shall  
receive the sum of fifty dollars, and ten dollars shall  
be used for the benefit of such child, the payment  
of which sums must be satisfactorily proved by my  
executors I declare such bequest to be valid and  
void 7<sup>th</sup> of June and bequeath to Mrs Eliza Mackay  
my two negro slaves Sarah and Elizabeth, to her the  
said Mrs Eliza Mackay and her heirs forever -  
8<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to Catherine and Sarah  
Mackay the two unmarried daughters of Mrs Eliza Mackay  
the following fourteen negro slaves, Namely Old  
Maurice and Judith his wife John Blacksmith and  
Daphne his wife These four I desire shall be permit-  
ted to remain at Oaklands and have comfortable homes  
as long as they live; Flora Stephen Eliza and  
Lucinda, these four together with the preceding four  
I desire earnestly shall be permitted all such privilege  
and indulgence and freedom as are not inconsistent  
with the laws of the State of Georgia. At my home

Maurice Polly Clark Samuels and Eliza Stiles my  
said Catherine and Sarah Mackay and their  
for ever to their sole and separate use, and not subject  
to debts contracts or control of any future husband, and  
in case of the marriage of either the said Catherine or said  
Mackay I direct that this property be settled in trust  
for their sole and separate use of the wife and bequeath  
each to Margaret Anna Stiles wife of Benjamin C. Stiles  
the following negro slaves namely Ruthie and any chil-  
dren she may have, Tommy [Carpenter] Simpson Daphne  
and any children, Kelly Martha and Sue, which three  
last are now in the possession of Mr. Stiles Adam Hollings-  
ton, Harry Luce's husband Old Prince Radcliff, and  
Nigger to her the said Mary Ann Stiles for her sole and  
separate use and not subject to the debts contracts or control  
of her present or any future husband, for and during  
the term of her natural life, and from and immediately  
after the death of the said Mary Ann Stiles I give  
bequeath the said negro slaves to the daughter of the  
said Mary A. Stiles, the child or children of any deceased  
daughter to stand in the place and take the same  
to which its dec'd parent would have been entitled  
if in life - 10th I give and bequeath to Sarah Mackay  
daughter of Mrs. Maria Mackay - the following negro  
slaves - namely Church & Miller (her brother) to  
her the said Sarah Mackay for her sole and separate  
use and not subject to the debts contracts or control  
of any future husband, and in case of the marriage  
of the said Sarah I direct that this property be settled  
in trust for her sole and separate use 11th I give  
and bequeath to Margaret Elliot, wife of Dr. Charles E.  
Elliot the following negro slaves; Namely Molly and  
Uiram (which two are now in her possession) Harry  
Blacksmith, Bella and any children she may have  
Mary Marshall Betsy Old Lucy and Peggy - 12th her  
the said Margaret Elliot for her sole and separate use  
and not subject to the debts contracts or control of her pre-  
sent or any future husband for and during the term of her  
natural life, and from and immediately after the death  
of the said Margaret Elliot, I give and bequeath the said  
negro slaves to the daughter of the said Margaret  
Elliot, the child or children of any deceased daughter  
to stand in the place and take the same to which  
its dec'd parent would have been entitled if in life 13th I  
give and bequeath to Eliza C. Stiles wife of William Henry  
Stiles the following negro slaves - Harry Abel, John  
Anne, Sue, which last is now in possession of her  
son Harry Abel, her child, the last three being the children  
of the late Mrs. Anna Bryan, son by Sam Bryan  
is not to be named

to her the said Negro Slave for her sole and separate use, and not subject for any manner to the debts contracts or  
contests in continuall of her present or any future husband  
for and during the term of her natural life, and from  
and wages totally after the death of the said Eliza A  
Styles I give and bequeath the said negro slave to  
the daughter or daughters of the said Eliza A Styles  
the childe or children of any deceased daughter to stand  
in her place and take to which the deceased parent  
would have been intitell if in life 13<sup>th</sup> I give and  
bequeath to Robert Mackay the following negro slaves  
Namely, Charlotte and her two Son, Richard and Maggie  
together with any other children she may have and Bot  
Charlotte brother) to him the Said Robert Mackay and his  
heirs forever. 14<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to William Mackay  
the following negro slaves - Namely April and Comba  
his wife together with their three Son and any other  
children they may have, Jenny (Comba's mother)  
Wellingtby Hartwell and John Baptist to him the said  
William Mackay and his heirs forever 15<sup>th</sup> I give and  
bequeath to Eliza Williamson the two following negro  
slaves Namely Betsy Young I gave to her the said  
Eliza Williamson and her heirs forever for her sole and  
separate use, and not subject to the debts contracts or contests  
of any future husband, and in case of the marriage of the said  
Eliza Williamson, I direct that this property be settled in trust  
for her sole and separate use - 16<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to Mrs  
my Cousin Mrs Andrew Murray of Kincaidbright in Scotland  
any Annuity of three Hundred Dollars, during the term of  
her natural life, payment of the same to cease at her  
death, for her own <sup>by</sup> separate use absolutely, which sum  
is to be remitted to her Annually by my Executore as  
Interest or dividends shall be collected 17<sup>th</sup> I give and  
bequeath to Miss Sidney Anderson of Bristol England  
any Annuity of two hundred dollars during the term of  
her natural life, payment of the same to cease at her  
death, to be remitted to her Annually by my Executore  
18<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to Mrs Barrett L Mardon  
of Exeter, England and to the two Misses Baillie now  
living with Mrs Mardon the sum of two thousand dollars  
to be equally divided between them, share and share alike  
and in case of the death of either Mrs Mardon or either the  
Misses Baillie, I give and bequeath the said sum of two  
thousand dollars, to the survivor or survivors. Also give and  
bequeath to John Leopold Abel of Dennington Shrews  
shire £1000 - the sum of One thousand Dollars and in the  
case of the death of the Said John L Abel, then the said  
sum of one thousand <sup>will</sup> to be equally divided among his  
children. Also give and bequeath to Mrs Ann Karr  
daughter of William Karr a married wife of William H. Karr

of Texas; the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, which you shall bequeath to Mary Cooper Stiles, the daughter of William & and Eliza A. Stiles, the sum of five hundred dollars, I nominate, constitute and appoint Catherine and Sarah Mackay my residuary Legatees, the same to be for their sole and separate use and not subject to the debts, contracts or control of any future husband, and in case of the marriage of either the said Catherine or Sarah, then I appoint the saids may residuary Legatees, desirous that whatever property they may receive from my Estate, whether directly or by reversion, whether real or personal shall be settled in trust for their sole and separate use, Lastly I nominate, constitute and appoint William Duncan & William both Mackay, both of the City of Savannah in the County of Chatham and State of Georgia Executors of this my last Will and Testament — In witness whereof I the said Mary Anne Cooper, have to this my last will and Testament, contained in this and the six preceding pages set my hand and seal this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1852.
