4th Item: I appoint the said Terence Kugent my executor of this my last will and Testament

Fourthly: I give, devise and bequeath unto my son Francis Chubb, the following Slaves - namely; Sara Abby, Joe, Thomas, William and Sarah, for his own sole and separate use during the life and at his
