 of land six acres adjoining lands of Benjamin Fisher
 Esq. and the house on said Lot of land with all the
 rights members and appurtenances to said Lot of land
 in any wise belonging free from all charges or limitations
 whatever to her own use benefit and behoof forever
 with full power to dispose of the same at any time
 previous or by will or deed at her death as she may
 think proper.
