fund for that purpose my stock in trade and all debts due and owing
to me at the time of my death and desire that the proceeds arising
therefrom be first applied to the payment of my said debts and funeral
expenses by my Executrix hereinafter named

Second I give and devise unto my mother Sophia Tow half
Lot number four (4) Washington Ward and City of Savannah whereon
she now resides with its improvements. To have and to hold the same
for and during the term of her natural life - and from and immediately
after the death of my said mother Sophia Tow I give and devise the
same to my beloved wife Margaret. M. Dibble and to such child or children
the issue of my marriage with her as shall be living at the time of
my death share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns for ever

Third I give and bequeath unto my said mother Sophia Tow a
negro woman named Charlotte to have and to hold the same for her use
during the term of her natural life and from and immediately after
the death of my said mother I give and bequeath the said negro woman
Charlotte and her future issue and increase unto my beloved wife
Margaret. M. Dibble and to such child or children the issue of my
marriage with her as shall be living at the time of my death share and
share alike

Fourth - I give and devise unto my beloved wife Margaret M Dibble
and to such child or children the issue of my marriage with her as
shall be living at the time of my death the Northern half of Lot
number four Washington Ward and City of Savannah with its improve-
ments To have and to hold the same to them their heirs and assigns
forever

Fifth - I give and bequeath unto my said beloved wife Margaret M Dibble
and to such child or children the issue of my marriage with her my
two slaves Peter and Elisha to have and to hold the same to them their
heirs and assigns for ever

Sixth - All the rest residue and remainder of my Estate real
personal and mixed not hereinbefore specifically given or devised
I give devise and bequeath unto my said beloved wife Margaret M
Dibble and to such child or children the issue of my marriage with

her who shall be living at the time of my death share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns forever - Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my said wife Margaret M. Dibble Sole Executrix of this my last will and testament and hereby nominate and appoint for testamentary guardian of the persons and property of my said children who may be living at the time of my death.
