Last Will & Testament of Mrs Ellen Duffy widow of the late Clarence Duffy of the City of Savannah

In the name of God the most Holy Trinity Father Son & Holy Ghost Amen, I Ellen Duffy, widow of Clarence Duffy late of this City, do hereby make my last Will & Testament in manner and form following: to wit - I desire that all my just debts ^{as far as possible} be paid as soon after my death as possible. 2 To each of my nieces Mary, Catherine & Elizabeth, daughters of Ross & Margaret Duffy, now residents of the City of New York, in the event of their surviving me, I bequeath one hundred dollars each and bequeath to Rev J. Connel Dorr of the City of Savannah the sum of two hundred & fifty (250) dollars to be invested by him in the manner he may judge most advisable for the benefit of the children of my niece Mary Duffy alias Marrow, the wife of Patrick Marrow now residing in the City of Savannah. Each child of the aforesaid Patrick Marrow & Mary Duffy to receive his or her share of the specified two hundred & fifty (250) dollars with interest accruing thereon, so soon as he or she shall have attained the age of twenty one years. 4 To Catherine Wall daughter of Thomas Wall of this City, I

bequeath the sum of twenty dollars - & To the Right Rev. Charles
 E. Cartman Bishop of Savannah I bequeath the sum of one
 hundred (100) dollars towards the erection of a Cathedral Church
 & Should there be any surplus after paying the aforesaid
 various bequests, I bequeath the same to the Religious Community
 of the Sisters of Mercy of the City of Savannah to be appro-
 priated to the support of Orphan children under their charge
 My various articles of clothing and furniture I bequeath
 to my niece aforesaid Mary Duffy wife of Patrick Duffy
 of Warren & I hereby appoint the Rev. C. McNell Senr of the
 City of Savannah Executor of this my Last Will & Testament
 In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand
 & seal this thirty-first day of August in the year of our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred fifty-two
