The last will and Testament of Green Fleetwood of the City of Savannah in the State and County aforesaid - I Green Fleetwood considering the uncertainty of this mortal and being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, First I direct my body to be decently interred and my funeral conducted in a manner suitable to my situation in life, and as to such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to intrust me with - I dispose of as follows, I give, sell, assign the payment of all my just debts not barred by the Statute of limitations - I give, bequeath and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Fleetwood, all my Estate, both real and personal to her and to hold my said Estate unto my said wife Mary Fleetwood

In and during her natural life (or widowhood, as  
 she may after her decease) and from and after her  
 death, then to my children by the said Mary Fleetwood  
 and to their heirs and assigns forever, share and share  
 alike as tenants in common and not as joint tenants  
 the representatives or representatives of the deceased shall  
 to stand in the place of the parent. But should my  
 said wife Mary Fleetwood, survive then and in that  
 event, I do hereby dispose of my Estate in manner  
 following - I give and bequeath unto my said  
 wife Mary all of the one seventh part of all my  
 Estate, both real and personal, to have and to hold  
 the said one seventh part of all my said Estate, both  
 real and personal, unto my said wife Mary, in and  
 during her natural life, and from and after her  
 death to my children by the said Mary and to their  
 heirs and assigns forever, share and share alike. And
