Hunter all the property, whereof I shall die posses-
sed, real and personal, of every kind and descrip-
tion, wherever it may be and in whatever it may
consist.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my
said wife Susan Francis Hunter, executrix and my
friend Robert St. Griffin, Executor, of this my will.
