and memory, calling to mind the frailty of human nature, and being  
desirous of settling my worldly affairs, and directing how ~~my~~<sup>my</sup>  
estate should be disposed, do make and publish this my last will  
and testament hereby revoking and making void and null all  
other last wills and testaments heretofore made by me, viz.

And first I commend my soul to God and my body to the earth,  
to be buried as my Executors hereinafter mentioned may direct.

My will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses,  
shall by my Executors hereinafter named be paid out of my estate, as  
soon after my decease, as shall by them be found convenient.

I give, and bequeath, my house and lot situated in Congress  
Street, between Stone Street and East Broad Street described on City map as the  
Western half Lot 2930, to my wife Margaret and my female children  
named respectively Margaret and Ellen Kane, and I furthermore direct  
that in case of my wife marrying again or otherwise misconducting  
herself, that the aforesaid property be devised in whole to the two  
children aforesaid.

I also, my Executors to appropriate the five shares which  
I have in the Savannah Mutual Loan Association towards the expense  
of my interment, and should any balance remain after said interment,  
to be given towards the support of my surviving wife & children.

I bequeath to my wife & children all my household goods  
and furniture.

I do nominate and appoint Patrick Dubridy and James  
Morrissey to be my Executors to this my last will and Testament.

In testimony whereof I Daniel Kane have to this 10th day  
properly subscribed my name and affixed my seal this Tenth day  
of November One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty One (1861)

been rectified before the signing of
