

The last will and Testament of William Mackay

- 1st I bequeath to my Mother Mrs Eliza Mackay every thing I possess both real Estate and Personal property except the Legacies which I have to pay as long as she may live and after her death to my two Sisters Catherine and Sarah Mackay Share and Share alike and who are my residuary Legatees
- 2nd My debts are to be paid a list of which is herewith inclosed
- 3rd I bequeath to my Sister Mrs M. A. Stiles besides what she now has 5 Lots in the Town of Haverhill Tennessee and 10 Shares Stock in C. A. & Gulf Road all paid up.
- 4th I bequeath to my Brother in Law Wm H. Stiles my half of 24 Lots of Land owned jointly with him in the Cherokee County also two notes of his which I hold amounting together to about \$500. And to my Sister Mrs W. H. Stiles 59 Shares Wm. & P. Bank Stock \$10. per Share paid in
- 5th I bequeath to my Sister Mrs B. E. Elliott Lot no 13 near the new Savannah
- 6th I bequeath to Henry Brown my half of the Lot near Savannah now owned jointly with me
- 7th I bequeath to my Brother in Law Joseph Bryan Lot no 16 Swamp land also the northern half of Lot no 37 Swamp land

I ask my Sister Catherine Mackay to act as my Executor
