chattels so help me God

Georgia May 10th 1837  
Chatham County I Charles H Mills being of sound  
and disposing mind and memory And well knowing  
the uncertainty of this mortal life do make and pub-  
lish this my last will and testament under seal by  
virtue of the power vested in me in and by the fourth  
step of the last will and testament of my beloved  
husband George H Mills bearing date 2nd day of  
December in the year of our lord one thousand eight hun-  
dred and forty nine  
It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid  
out of the Estate real and personal Goods & claims to me  
by my said husband by his last will and testament  
After the payment of my just debts I give to my beloved brother  
Charles Henry Allen ten thousand dollars with my blessing  
for all the love and affection bestowed upon me through-  
out my life He has been devoted in his substance when  
we required it And I feel this is only a small proof  
of my affection for him He is to have the interest during  
his lifetime & at his death it is to go to my wife and Sarah  
Jane Allen but should they both die before him it is at his  
death to vest back to his Sister Sabella Hardin and Fannie  
Lewis.  
To my two Sisters Sallie leave each five thousand dollars  
they to pay the interest and at their death to be divided among  
their children  
To John Lewis I request a handsome piece of silver given  
him with my love  
To Mary and Margaret Henry I request that five hundred  
dollars may be sent them with my love To Rachel  
Black and Elizabeth Smith I desire two hundred  
and fifty dollars be given them  
The remainder whatever it may be to be divided  
among my children Joe Matilda Emma Peter  
& Eliza I trust they will not feel this imposition  
of my property as a proof of my love it was

left me by their Father as he told me to dispose of  
in any way I pleased and it is a comfort to give it  
to those who I know will use it  
Knowing how the property is situated if it can  
be arranged by my son Joseph to pay these debts  
it would be better than having it sold or the paper  
by divided my children have my most devoted affection  
I know they have enough of this world's goods for their  
comfort and it is a consolation  
Wishing we may all meet in another and better  
world I commend you all to the care of our Covenant God
