This is the 3rd Stem I give devise and bequeath all the rest of my estate of the
this Stem and whatever character or description real or personal to my children
was bequeathed before William Moul James I Moul and Harriet Moul to them and their
heirs forever share and share alike as tenants in common.

Stem 2nd I give devise and bequeath to my two grand children
Pete Henry and Catharine Taylor Moul the sum of one hundred and
five dollars now in the savings bank to be equally divided
between them.

Stem 4th I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my
son William Moul to be the Executor of this my last will
and testament

In testimony whereof I the said Ann Moul
have to this my last will and testament contained on two
pages of paper subscribed my name and affixed my seal
this ninth day of January in the year eighteen hundred and
fifty two.

ment of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ
I give and bequeath all my just debts to paid without delay
I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved niece
Mary Damer, wife of George Wallace Damer, my late
of said sixth acres adjoining lands of Benjamin Fisher
Esqr and the house on said lot of land with all the
rights members and appurtenances to said lot of land
in any wise belonging free from all charges or limitations
whenever to her own use benefit and behoof forever
with full power to dispose of the same at any time
persons or by will or deed at her death as she may
think proper.

I give and bequeath in the same somewhat
manner to the said Mary Damer one horse and wagon
three negro slaves, a man named Abram about 30 years
of age, another named Abram about forty years of age,
and a woman Hinda about 20 years of age together
with her future issue and increase, the farming utensils
used on the said sixth acres with the other effects beds
bedding yards poultry household and kitchen furniture.
