Item first I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent manner according to the Roman Catholic Religion my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Virgin and Divine Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed.

Item second I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay.

Item third I give and devise to my beloved wife Helen Riley and my children the house and the lot on which they are situated being in Robertsville in the City of Savannah.

Item fourth I give and give to my beloved wife Helen and my children one wooden house and the back room at the corner of Westward and Margaret Streets.

I constitute and appoint my Brother William Riley, and my secret friend John F. O'Neill Executors to this my last Will and Testament to manage my Estate in the best advantage and for the benefit of my beloved wife and children, placing full confidence in the integrity, ability and worthiness of my said Executors.
