and Memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst
I have strength and capacity so to do, do make and publish
this my last Will and Testament. hereby revoking and making
void, all former Wills by me, at any time heretofore made
And First and Principal, I commit my soul into the Hands
of Almighty God, who gave it and my body to the Earth
to be decently buried. And as to such sum of Estate, wherewith
it has pleased God to entrust me, I dispose of the same as
follows To wit

1st Item It is my Will that all my just debts, and the
Charges of my Funerals be paid and discharged by my Executors,
hereinafter named and appointed out of my Estate as soon as
conveniently may be, after my decease, and that my said Executors
do proceed as soon thereafter as may be possible to convert all
my Property or Estate, both real and Personal into money; either
by Public or by Private sale, as to them may seem best.

2nd Item I give and bequeath to Edward Payler, James B. Bolles
and John Braddock, all of Hartford in the State of Connecticut
or to the survivor of them the sum of Two Thousand Five
Hundred dollars in Trust, to and for the sole and separate
use of my sister Mrs Margaret Olcott for and during the
term of her Natural life; said sum to be paid to the said Trustees
within one year or sooner, if my said Estate be within that time
sold; the annual income arising from said sum to be appropriated
entirely to the support of my said sister during her lifetime as aforesaid,
and at and after her death, then the said Two Thousand five hundred
dollars and any interest that may then be due on it to go to
my niece Mary Croker, Absolutely to her and her heirs forever.

3rd Item I give and bequeath to Edward Bolles, James B. Bolles and
John Braddock Trustees as aforesaid, the sum of One Thousand
five hundred dollars, to be paid to said Trustees, in manner
and form as before mentioned, in Trust to and for the
use of my Brother Benjamin Bolles (The Annual income arising
from said fund to be appropriated in such manner as said
