I, Abraham Sutcliffe of the City of Savannah do make and publish this my last and only will and testament. I constitute and appoint my friends Mrs. Cunningham of the firm Blagburn and Cunningham, and John Randall Trevelyan of the firm Bradburn Trevelyan and Co. Executors of this my last will and testament.

For the more ready settlement of my Estate, I authorize my Executors to sell and convey all my real and personal Estate, and invest the money after my just debts have been paid, on C. R. R. Bonds and the Interest to be applied for the education of my two sons, and principal to be used if the Interest is not sufficient to support and clothe them.

I wish my sons Charles Henry and Edmund to be educated in England at some Boarding school near Liverpool where the Church of England doctrines are promulgated.

I constitute and appoint my friend Robert Hutchinson, former Chambers Liverpool Guardian or Trustee for my Children, having an Interest of £400 in a House at Kew Bridge Lane in Yorkshire and also an expectancy of something more from my uncle Thomas Patchett of Kew Bridge

I wish both my sons to be kept at the boarding school until they are eighteen years of age. If Charles Henry is steady and present at that time I authorize my Executors to see $\frac{1}{2}$ the amount in his hands and remit to the Trustee or pay it to him in this city. I wish Edmund to go through the same process in schooling but if either of them should prove bad boys, I leave in optional for my Executors and Trustee to retain the principal until they arrive at twenty five years of age. In the event of the death of either of them, the survivor to take all the Estate. In case they should both die then I wish my unmarried sisters to have the interest and if they marry or die, then I wish my Executors and Trustee to give one half to my Mrs. Thomas' children, and the other half to Mrs. Georges children. In the event of George having none, then Thomas' to have the whole.

And last I do declare this to be my last and only will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Savannah this fifth day of April Eighteen hundred and fifty three.
