I, Margaret Scott of the said City of Savannah being of sound mind and disposing memory do make publish and declare this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all wills heretofore made by me.

First. I give and bequeath to my Nephew James Oliver of Scotland Ten Shares of the Capital Stock of the Central Rail Road, and Bank of Georgia, or the proceeds of the sale thereof to be paid to him at my decease, but should the said James Oliver be not then in life then I give and bequeath the said Ten Shares of Stock to my Niece Miss Mary Margaret Young of the said City of Savannah for and during the term of her natural life and at and after her death then I give and bequeath the same to The Directors of the Savannah Free School for the use of their charity.

Second. I give and bequeath to Robert Scott son of Robert H. and Belle Scott of Savannah One Bond of the City of Savannah for the payment of Five Hundred Dollars and One Bond of the Murcheson Rail Road for the payment of Five Hundred Dollars and a negro boy named Troublesome to him and his heirs forever: the income of said Bonds to be applied to his maintenance and education, the principal to be paid to him upon his arriving at age: It is my will that his Mother shall have the use and services of the said Slave until the said Robert Scott shall arrive at age. Witness our hand and seal this 10th day of May 1862.

Third. I give and bequeath to my Executors hereinafter named the sum of Five Hundred Dollars now on deposit in the Merchants and Planters Bank of Savannah to be by them paid or applied to the

use a benefit of said Robert R. Scott or to his said wife Betille or to their said son Robert Scott as they may deem best their discretion in the use and payment of said sum to be without control.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my friend Miss E. Porter Stewart Three Shares of the Capital Stock of The State Bank of Georgia in the City of Savannah, but should she not be in life at the time of my death, or the death of my said niece Jane M. Young, to whom I give the said Three Shares of Stock for her life, I should give and bequeath the said Three Shares of Stock to my ordinary legatee herein after named.

Fifth. The residue of my estate real, personal or mixed, of whatsoever kind or description, or wheresoever situated, I give, devise and bequeath to my niece Miss Jane Margaret Young of Savannah for and during the term of her natural life and at and after her death I dispose of the same as follows viz:

Sixth. I give and bequeath to the Church Wardens and Vestrymen of the Episcopal Church in Savannah called Christ Church Ten Shares of the Capital Stock of The Central Rail Road and Banking Company of Georgia and to their Successors to be by them held upon the following Conditions and trusts viz: So that the net annual income arising therefrom to the main tenance and support of the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the State of Georgia: and I further give and bequeath Ten Shares of said Capital Stock to The Savannah Female Orphan Asylum and its Successors forever: and I further give and bequeath Ten other Shares of said Capital Stock of the Central Rail Road to The Ashlams Home of the Protestant Episcopal Church of Chatham County and to its Successors forever.

Seventh. I give and bequeath to The Widows Society in Savannah Six Shares of the Capital Stock of The Bank of Savannah and its Successors to be applied to the furnishing and fitting out the Building at the East end of Broughton Street in the said City of Savannah called the "Widows Home".

Eighth. I give and bequeath to William James Bullock of the City of Savannah and his heirs forever Five Shares of the Capital Stock of the Planters Bank of the State of Georgia, and I further give and bequeath to him my slave Robert to him and his heirs forever with the request that the said Slave may be permitted to have such liberty and control of himself as the laws of the State will allow, and that should he, the said slave, desire to go from this State he may be allowed to do so.

Ninth. I give and bequeath to Mrs Ellen Crocus wife of William L. Crocus of Savannah my Cordial Stand: to Miss Mary Houston my Silver Fish Knife: to Doctor Richard D. Arnold my Iron Gravy Spoon: to Miss Margaret Wellman one half dozen table spoons: to Mrs Laura Locke one dozen large Silver forks: to Mrs Adah Hunter my silver Candle and one dozen Tea Spoons: to Miss Louisa Bullock one dozen small forks and one dozen dessert spoons: to Miss Elliott daughter of Bishop Elliott my gold watch: to Florence Locke two dance ladders: to Mr William Bullock one half dozen table spoons: to Miss Sarah

Cecil one half dozen table spoons

Eighth - I give and bequeath my bed room furniture to Mrs. Elizabeth Scott, wife of Robert R. Scott of Savannah, to her sole and separate use free from the debts or contracts of any other person

Ninth - The residue of my Estate of every kind and description I give, devise and bequeath to William James Bullock of the City of Savannah whom I declare to be my residuary legatee, to him and his heirs forever

And Lastly I nominate and appoint Miss Jane Margaret Young, Doctor Richard D Arnold and William James Bullock all of said City of Savannah Executors and Executors of this my last will and testament

provisionally abiding in the City of Augusta, being in feeble health
but of sound and disposing mind and memory, revoking
all former wills made by me, do now make, ordain and publish
this present writing as and for my last will and Testament,
in manner following: that is to say

First, To my nephew Edward J. Campbell, I give bequeath and
devise my Lot and Dwelling house in the City of Savannah
with all and singular the right, maner, privileges and ac-
cumbances thereto, and all and singular the household
and Kitchen furniture in and about the same, or properly
belonging thereto, excepting the bedsteads and bedding, with
their appurtenances, however, that my nephew George Jones
shall have the possession, use and enjoyment of the said Lot
Dwelling and appurtenances from the time of my decease
until the end of one year after the termination of the existing
war between the Confederate States and the United States of
America, without the payment of Rent or other compensation
therefor to my Executors or the Devisee thereof, named in
my Will. I also give and bequeath in my said Will to
Edward J. Campbell all the Plate, China and Glassware
therein or properly appertaining thereto, excepting only
such parts thereof as I may hereinafter otherwise dispose
of; and also all the stock now owned by me in any in-
corporated Bank, Rail Road, Banking or other joint stock
Company excepting only such parts and so much thereof
as I may hereinafter give and bequeath to other persons.
Second, To my nephew, the said George Jones, I give &
bequeath twenty (20) Shares of the Capital Stock of the
Central Rail Road and Banking Company; ten (10) Shares
of that of the Marine Bank, ten (10) of the Bank of the
State of Georgia, and ten (10) of the Merchants and Planters
