In the name of God! Amen! I James Mayne of the County and State aforesaid being weak in body but of sound disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby avowing and making null and void all other former wills by me made.

First I desire that my body should be entred at the Church at White Bluff in the County of Chatham and a suitable monument to be erected over my remains; and I request my Executors to expend out of my Estate the sum of Two hundred and fifty Dollars for the purpose of placing a suitable fence around said Church yard at White Bluff. Secondly I desire that all my funeral expenses and expenses of my last sickness be paid.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my qualified Executors in Trust for the sole separate and exclusive use of Mrs Ann Hazel the wife of Joseph Hazel of Bamford South Carolina

Leaving the following slaves viz my old negro man Jimmy
together with his daughter Bessie and her child Davy also
Jimmy's sister old Betty (maid wife) likewise Glasgow and Kate
also old woman Sarah. To have and to hold for the sole
separate and exclusive use of the said Ann Hazel her execu-
tors administrators and assigns forever. I invoke for these
slaves the kind treatment of their new mistress.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my friends Robert
Lacklison my servant Henry the son of Kate Potter also
the sum of Twenty five hundred Dollars to him his heirs
executors administrators and assigns forever

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my executors who may
qualify my slave Catherine (the sister of Nancy) in Trust
for the sole separate and exclusive use of Mrs Maria Lacklison
the wife of Robert Lacklison to her her heirs executors adminis-
trators and assigns forever

Sixthly I give and bequeath to each of the children of
Robert Lacklison viz James Eleanor and Elizabeth the sum
of two hundred Dollars each

Seventhly I give and bequeath to Mrs Maria Scriven the
wife of Benjamin Scriven of Grahamville of South Carolina
all my silver plate for her sole separate and exclusive use
and disposal forever

Eighthly I give and bequeath to George Washington Broughton
of Grahamville South Carolina my set of white Chamberlains
and forks

Ninthly I direct my Executors to receive out of my estate
the sum of Two hundred Dollars for a special purpose
which I will explain in a note to them

Tenthly I direct my Executors to sell and dispose of (I
prefer a private sale if possible with due regards to present
a sacrifice) my plantation or tract of lands called Main
Hall on Ogeechee Road in the County of Chatham in said
State containing about one thousand and seventy acres
also all my stock of cattle horses mules sheep poultry plan-
tation implements &c Also all my negro slaves not before specially
bequeathed and all other property real or personal which I may
die seized or possessed of and I give full power and authority
to such of my Executors as may qualify to make such
sales and execute proper titles to the purchasers. I request
that the slaves may be permitted to choose responsible
owners for themselves if such persons are willing to pay a
fair price for said slaves and that said slaves be sold
in families unless they desire otherwise. I would recommend
(but not insist on) the following slaves to be sold together
in families viz 1st Richards his wife Nancy Cook &c their
children Edward Caroline and Osborne also Winda sister
of Richard 2nd Beeter Dinah his sister and Betsey & Julia
daughters of Dinah 3rd William (divorced) and Betsey his wife

wife and Peggy and Sarah (daughters of Peter) & Sarah Agge
his mother (Cook) and her daughters Raphaela & Mary & Elizabeth
Thomas her son and Henry (a stable boy) son of Peter & Sarah
her son b. Semmima, dairy woman & house servant &c

Eleventh I direct that from the proceeds of said sale my
Executors pay the foregoing pecuniary legacies: and then that
my said Executors pay to my sister Mrs Mary Tudor of Chichester
Sussex England the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to her her
executors administrators and assigns forever: and a like sum to
her son Adolphus Tudor his heirs executors administrators and
assigns forever: and a like sum of Two Thousand Dollars to her
daughter Miss Amy Tudor her Executors administrators and assigns
forever. and a like sum to John Sharpe the son of my late
brother John Sharpe his heirs executors administrators & assigns
forever, it being my intention to give to each of said Parties
if now living the sum of Two Thousand Dollars out of my
estate and to be disposed of as each of them seem fit.

Twelfth I give and bequeath all the balance of proceeds
that may arise from said sales of property after the payment
of the foregoing legacies to be divided equally between William
Gowen of Camden County Georgia; George W. Broughton of Graham
ville South Carolina and Mrs Maria Screven the wife of
Benjamin Screven of Grahamville South Carolina: that is
to say one third to each of said parties the share of Mrs
Screven to be held by my qualified Executors in trust
for the sole separate and exclusive use and disposal
of herself.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my friends Robert
Lachlison John Williamson and John P W Pease the Executors
of this my will
