I Stephen E Waterhouse of the County & State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament Revoking any and all by me heretofore made.

I Item First

I direct that all my debts be paid out of the income arising from my interest in the Grove Plantation situated in Chatham County and the slaves thereon amounting to about one hundred and seven except a debt of Nine Thousand Dollars due to my Sister Isabella R. Wong in which I direct to remain as a charge upon my Estate until the claims payment thereof.

I Item Second

After the payment of my said debts excepting the said Nine Thousand Dollars I direct that the following legacies be paid out of the income in the first Item set forth as it may accrue but without interest.

To my Cousin Robert R Waterhouse five hundred dollars

To my aunt Mrs Boone one thousand dollars

To my aunt Mrs Barnwell one thousand dollars.

To my Cousin Stephen Elliott Jr. five hundred dollars.

To my Cousin Frederick A. Waterhouse five hundred dollars

To my aunt Mrs Susan Waterhouse five Shillings in the Savannah

I Item Third

It is my will and I direct that during the period that the debts and legacies are being paid as aforesaid that there shall be paid from the income aforesaid in the first Item set forth the sum of one thousand dollars annually on the first day of January unto my Sister Isabella R Waterhouse in addition to the debt due upon my said debt of Nine Thousand dollars this legacy to be a primary charge

I Item Fourth

I direct the sum of two thousand dollars to be annually paid  
out of the said income to the Rev Mr G. Williams which was  
times in charge of the Oguchie Mission

Item Fifth

Subject to the aforesaid debts and legacies I give devise and  
bequeath the income aforesaid unto to my Sister Isabella and  
my Brother William for and during the term of their natural  
lives and to the survivor of them for and during the term of  
his or her natural life but I will and direct that in each year  
every year after the payment of the debts and legacies except the said  
debt of nine thousand dollars that the said income shall exceed the  
sum of five thousand dollars clear of all expenses that the sum of one  
Thousand dollar shall be annually paid to Mrs Elliott the wife of my  
Uncle the Right Reverend Stephen Elliott to her sole and entire use  
for the support of her family <sup>and after his death to be paid to the</sup>  
~~and after his death to be paid to the~~  
~~survivor of her~~  
~~and the lives of the saids William & Isabella~~

Item Fifth

From and after the death of my sister Isabella and my Brother  
William I give devise and bequeath all my right title and interest  
in the said grove Plantation and slaves with the increase of said slaves  
unto my Cousins Robert Elliott John Elliott and Habersham Elliott Sons  
of my Uncle the right Rev. Stephen Elliott for and during the term of  
their natural lives and from and after their death to such child or  
children or Representatives of children as they may have at the time of  
their death there and I have alike to take per Stirpes and not per  
Capita and should either the said Robert John or Habersham  
die without leaving any child or Representative of a child living at  
the time of his death then the said share herein to him devised shall  
go to the survivor or survivors this estate so devised however to  
the said Robert John and Habersham I direct and it is my will  
shall be charged upon coming into their possession with the payment  
by them to their Sisters Father Sarah and Charlotte their heirs and assigns  
of the sum of Ten Thousand dollars to be divided equally between  
them and I direct that this legacy shall be a lien upon said estate  
for its payment

Item Seventh

I give devise and bequeath my Furniture pleasure house  
and all and Singular all the Rent and Residue of my Estate unto  
my Brother William and his heirs forever

Item Eighth

I nominate my Brother William Habersham my Executor  
and my Sister Isabella my Executrix to this my Will with power  
to them to make and execute any sale or Mortgage which  
they may deem necessary or beneficial to my Estate both in case  
of sale requirement to be made subject to the deposition of  
this my Will
