 I Subscribing John Gabriel Church planter of the French town parish
 Santa Rosa Jurisdiction of French Bay District of the island of the
 Islands of San Domingo residing in this French town parish State
 of Senegal one of the United States of the New American being
 moved of the Holy spirit & memory and willing to settle my
 temporal business of the goods which I have, I desire to let me have
 I make the presents testament & ordinance of my last will
 1st I recommend my soul to almighty God my creator and
 pray for pardon me my sins and give me his Saint's pardon
 2nd Being the last of my family I do Savannah and wishing
 to acknowledge the good offices I received from Louise Mathieu
 Russell and the good care she bestowed on me in my sickness
 during a number of years I being in Savannah I assign by
 these presents my legacies universal to which I left everything I
 possess in the house I inhabit viz merchandize clothes furniture
 and house hold implements -

Item - I bequeath to the said Louise Mathieu Russell
 my claims on the property I have in the Island of San Domingo
 she has to apply to M^r G. Vaudryer at Paris who had charge
 of my settling -
 I recommend to my legatee to make a decent funeral
 and to pay my debts -

I appoint for my Executor M^r Mordacai
 D'Yves and intimate him to execute the present will
 with fidelity after my decease - I repeat and annul any
 other will I had made before and willing these presents
 being executed as my last will - Made at Savannah State of
 Georgia 1st Dec 1847 Translated from the french writing

 duly sworn deposes and says that he was personally
 acquainted with John G. Church late of Chatham County
 that he is familiar with his hand writing and that the
 signature to the within instrument of writing purporting
 to be his last will and testament he believes to
 be the genuine signature of the said John G.

 will of the within named John G. Church deceased to you as now
 known or believe and that you will with and truly execute
 the same by paying first the debts and then the legacies contained
 in the said will as far as his goods and chattels will
 amount to extend and the law charge on and that you
 will make a true and perfect inventory of all assets

goods and chattels do help you truly

to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all
others heretofore made by me -
Item First - I direct and direct that all my just debts
be paid -
Item Second - I direct my Executors hereinafter named to
protect in every manner and by every means my friend
Robert Sackleson from any loss either to my Executor or as
security upon Bonds or otherwise -
Item Third - I direct my Executors upon the payment to
them of one hundred and five dollars by Michael Bendergast
to deliver to the said Michael Bendergast all that Lot
or parcel of land situate lying and being in the City of Savannah
in the County of Chatham and State of Georgia and known in the
plan of said City as Lot Number One / No 1 / first / 1st /
lying between Anson Ward with all the improvements thereon
and also all that the adjoining Lot known as Lot Number
Two / No 2 / First lying between Anson Ward in the City of
Savannah in the State of Georgia with all the im-
provements thereon recently purchased by me
at Sheriff's sale
Item Fourth - I hereby direct my executors herein
after named to sell my and all real and personal
Estate of which I may be seized and possessed either
at Public or Private Sale as they shall deem most
expedient - and to sell as fast as they can do so and
apply the proceeds of the said sales to the payment
of my debts - and I hereby clothe them or either of them
with full and ample power to make & execute good
and sufficient titles without my application to any
Court whatever or without advertising the same
Item Fifth - I give devise and bequeath all the rest
and residue of my Estate real personal and mixed
of which I may be seized and possessed after the pay-
ment of my just debts to Robert Sackleson - To have
and to hold the same upon the following uses and
trusts and none other First to keep all my Estate
remaining after the payment of my just debts
