The last will and testament of George
S Wait of the County of Chatham, I George S Wait of the
being of sound and disposing mind and memory but
knowing the uncertainty of life do make and publish
this my last will and testament in manner and
form following that is to say

Item I give and bequeath my three
following named negroes slaves namely old Mary her
daughter Ely and Ely's son Joe together with the
future issue and increase of the said female slaves
unto my mother Susan Wait to have and to hold the
same to my said mother Susan Wait and her assigns for
and during the term of her natural life and from and
immediately after her death I give and bequeath the same
unto my brother William Albion Wait his Executors
Administrators and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath all my library and books unto my
brother Philip D Wait his Executors administrators and assigns
for ever Item

Item I give and bequeath all my personal
enjoyments and fixtures unto my brother Benjamin D Wait
his Executors Administrators and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath my two horses called Harry and my
harness unto my brother James S Wait his Executors Administrators
and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my brother the aforesaid William Albion Wait, all my place or plantation called Pine Bay on the site of hope being all that tract of parcel of land situate lying and being at the north point of the site of hope in the said County of Chatham containing one hundred and fifteen acres of high land on the said site of hope which was conveyed to me by Thomas J. Welch by deed of bargain and sale signed sealed and delivered on the fourteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four and recorded in the office of the clerk of the Superior Court for said County in book No. No. No. Jones 268 and 269 and is therein more particularly described together with all and singular houses out houses tenements and improvements and also all and singular the furniture implements and utensils thereon or belonging or appertaining to the same to have and to hold all and singular the said premises to him the said William Albion Wait his heirs executors administrators and assigns to and for his and their own use forever Also I give and bequeath my negro woman slave Mary (the younger) and her future issue and increase unto the said William Albion Wait his executors administrators and assigns forever

Item I give well bequeath my Colt's Revolving pistol together with the case and fixings thereunto belonging or appertaining to my brother Edwin J. Wait his executors administrators and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath my gold watch to my sister Sarah Ann Wait her executors administrators and assigns forever

Lastly all the rest and residue of my estate whatsoever and wheresoever of what nature kind or quality soever the same may be and not herein before given or devised (after the the payment of my funeral expences legacies debts and just and lawful debts I do give devise and bequeath unto my mother the aforesaid Susan Wait to have and to hold unto her her heirs executors administrators and assigns to her and their own use forever

And I do hereby constitute my said brother James C. Wait sole executor of this my last will and testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto at my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five signed and sealed published and declared by the said George J. Wait as if he were his last will & testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses therunto
