and funeral expenses. I dispose of my property as  
follows - First - I give devise and bequeath unto the  
Trustees of Trinity Church for the Methodist Episcopal  
Church South in Savannah and to their successors  
and assigns forever, my Negro Slaves Zea, Tomow  
and his wife Rachael, Madeline and her three  
children Edward Margaret, and John, Phillip  
and her two children Peter and Abby, upon the  
following conditions and trusts viz, in trust to  
use and apply the income arising from the hire of  
said slaves or the proceeds of the sale thereof  
to be invested to the maintenance of the trustees  
shop of the Said Trinity Church. As to the said  
trustee may seem broken; but it is my will and  
desire that in no event shall the corpus of the  
trust fund be used or applied to any purpose  
when by it may be diminished. Secrid. It is my  
will and I desire that my executors hereinafter named  
Send my woman Maria and her son Charles and  
such other children she may have at the time of  
my death to such free State or Country as she may  
elect. Should she desire to go, and I charge upon  
that portion of my estate hereinby created in trust  
to the Trustees of Trinity Church for the Methodist  
Episcopal Church South in Savannah the expenses  
of sending my said slave Maria and her said  
children to the State or Country to which she may  
choose to go. But should my said slave Maria
