Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by
me - Item First - I desire and direct that all my
Last debts be paid by my Executor hereinafter appointed
as soon as possible - Item Second - I give and
bequeath in Trust to my Executor hereinafter named
the four Negro Slaves to wit Bill, Charles, Tom and
Singer in Trust that their Wages, shall be bestowed
to and for the Support and benefit of my Mother Mrs.
Naomi Westman for and during the term of her natural
life, and after her death, then in Trust, that the Wages
arising from the said four Negro Slaves shall
be invested to and for the benefit of the children of
Patrick Stanton by his present wife Jane E. Stanton
now born and to be born, during their minority, and
as and after each child shall attain the age of
Twenty One years, each child so becoming of age shall
receive his or her proportionate share of such invested
Wages and thenceforth also, his or her proportionate share
of the annual Wages of said Negroes, and when the
youngest of the said children shall have attained
the age of Twenty One years, then the whole of the income
hereby bequeathed shall be divided equally share and
share alike among all of the said children, but in case
no child or children of the said Patrick and Jane his
Wife shall live to attain the age of Twenty One years
then and in that case, I give and bequeath whatever
Wages may have accumulated, and the ^{Negroes} ~~Wages~~ themselves
to the Trustees of the Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church
South in the City of Savannah in Trust for the Support
and benefit of the Superannuated and retired preachers
of the Georgia Annual Conference - Item Third, I hereby
Constitute and appoint my worthy friends John M. Garlock
and Robert D. Walpole Executors of this my Last Will
and Testament, this December Second Eighteen Hundred
and fifty nine John S. Westman (Sd)
