Third - I give and bequeath to my Daughters Margaret H. and
Catharine D. five shares of the Capital Stock of the
Central and Western Wharf Company of the City of Augusta
State and County aforesaid with the condition that they be
sold and the proceeds applied to repaying my Dwelling and
Outbuildings at present occupied by me.
Fourth - I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret H. and
Catharine D. five shares of the Capital Stock - the three
following named Slaves with their future issue Sarah, William
Henry, Malinda, for her to hold or dispose of at any time in
any manner or form according to her will and pleasure.
Fifth - I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret H. the four following
named Slaves with their future issue each, Anthony, Eugene,
Maria, to have and to hold them during her natural life
and at her death they with their future issue to become the
property of the children of my son Philip D. by his present
Wife Elizabeth M.
Sixth - I give and bequeath to my daughter Catharine D. the eight
following named Slaves with their future issue, Samai, Julia,
John, Mary Ella, Sarah, Isaac, Julia, Sarah, to have and to hold
them without any restriction subject to her own will either to
sell hold or bequeath -
Seventh - I give and bequeath to the children of my son Philip
D. by his present wife Elizabeth M. three three acre or lots of
Land drawn in the Land Lottery of the State of Georgia known
and described in the Plat and Grant issued to me by the State
aforesaid, To wit - Lot numbered ninety three containing three
hundred and ninety acres situated in the first District
Chatham County as appears by Grant dated thirty of November
Eighteen hundred and twenty nine signed Geo. Forsythe Lot
Number Six Land containing three hundred and thirty acres
situated in the sixteenth District Early County as appears by
Grant dated thirty of November Eighteen hundred and twenty
nine signed Geo. Forsythe Lot Number Seven hundred and
Lot containing thirty acres situated in the Eighteenth District

Third section Chatham County as appears by last will, the
length of time eighteen hundred and fifty three, signed by
J. Mc Donald.

and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst
I have strength and capacity so to do, do make and publish
this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making
void, all former wills by me, at any time heretofore made
And first and principal, I commit my soul into the hands
of Almighty God, who gave it and my body to the earth
to be decently buried. And as to such worldly Estate, wherein
it has pleased God to entrust me, I dispose of the same as
follows. To wit

1st Item, It is my will that all my just debts, and the
charges of my funeral to be paid and discharged by my Executors,
hereinafter named and appointed out of my Estate as soon as
conveniently may be, after my decease, and that my said Executors
do proceed as soon thereafter as may be possible to convert all
my property, or Estate, both real and personal into money; either
by public or by private sale, as to them may seem best.

2nd Item I give and bequeath to Edward Bolles, James G. Bolles
and John Braddock, all of Hartford in the State of Connecticut
or to the survivor of them the sum of Two thousand five
hundred dollars in trust, to and for the sole and separate
use of my sister Mrs Margaret Olcott for and during the
term of her natural life; said sum to be paid to the said Trustees
within one year or sooner, if my said Estate be within that time
sold; the annual income arising from said sum to be appropriated
entirely to the support of my said sister during her lifetime as aforesaid,
and at and after her death, then the said Two thousand five hundred
dollars and any interest that may then be due on it to go to
my said Mary Bolles, Absolutely to her and her heirs forever.

3rd Item I give and bequeath to Edward Bolles, James G. Bolles and
John Braddock Trustees as aforesaid, the sum of One thousand
five hundred dollars, to be paid to said Trustees, in manner
and form as before mentioned, in trust to and for the
use of my Brother Benjamin Bolles (The Annual income arising
