

This is the Last Will and Testament of me Henry Otis Weyer of the City of Savannah in the County of Chatham and State of Georgia - In the name of God Amen I Henry Otis Weyer of the City County and State aforesaid do make publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and declaring Null and Void all and every other Will or Wills heretofore at any time made by me - First I give devise and bequeath the whole of my Estate both Real and Personal Property and effects of every kind and description whatever and Wheresoever situated to my beloved wife Mary Savage Weyer and my two sons Henry Karlstene Weyer and James Perfield Weyer to be divided between them in the following manner and proportion that is to say, Second To my beloved wife Mary Savage Weyer to give devise and bequeath the sum of twenty thousand dollars for and during the term of her natural life, and after her death to such person or persons as she may appoint and designate by her Last Will and Testament or by any instrument in nature of a last Will and Testament, and in default of such appointment then after her death, I give devise and bequeath the said twenty thousand dollars to be given to my wife for life to my two sons Henry Karlstene Weyer and James Perfield Weyer equally to be divided between them share and share alike to them their heirs Executors and administrators forever - Third to my two sons Henry Karlstene Weyer and James Perfield Weyer I give devise and bequeath the sum of ~~ten~~^{four} thousand dollars to each of them - Provided my Estate should be sufficient and amount to that sum after the payment of twenty thousand dollars as aforesaid bequeathed to my wife Mary Savage Weyer, but should my Estate fall short in value of the amount of forty thousand dollars then and in that case after the payment of the twenty thousand dollars herein bequeathed to my wife - I give devise and bequeath the balance of said Estate which may remain after payment of the said twenty thousand dollars to my two sons Henry Karlstene Weyer and James Perfield Weyer equally to be divided between them share and share alike. The part and portion bequeathed in this item of my Will and in the residuary Clause to my son Henry Karlstene Weyer I give devise and bequeath to him for and during the term of his natural life and from and immediately after his death to such child or children as he may leave living at his death, the child or children of any deceased child of his to take the share its deceased parent would have been entitled to if in life Fourth after the payment to my wife of twenty

Thousand dollars and to my sons of ten thousand
dollars each making forty thousand dollars as provided
for in the second and third items of this my will. Should
any residue and surplus of my estate remain, I give
and bequeath all such residue and surplus to
my said Wife Mary Savage Wier my son Henry Hartstone
Wyer and my son James Perfield Wyer equally to be
divided between them share and share alike. Fifth - I
give and bequeath my Gold Watch presented me by the
First Baptist Church in Brooklyn in the State of New
York to my wife Mary Savage Wier as a token of my
esteem. Sixth - I give and bequeath my books to my
son the Rev Henry Hartstone Wyer to him his Executors
or administrators forever. Lastly I nominate constitute
and appoint my friend Charles H. Mills of the City of
the City of Savannah State of Georgia Executor of this
my last Will and Testament - In testimony whereof
I Henry Otis Wyer have hereunto set my hand & seal
this thirtieth day of June in the year of our Lord
eighteen hundred and fifty six - Henry Otis Wyer

To Mary and Margaret Henry I request that five hundred
each may be sent them with my love To Paul
Black and Elizabeth Lamb I desire two hundred
and fifty dollars be given them
The remainder whatever it may be is to be divided
among my children Joe Matilda Emma Rosa
& I am sure they will not feel this disposition
of my property as a proof of my love it was
