

This is the Last Will and Testament of me Henry Olo
Wyer of the City of Savannah in the County of Chatham
and State of Georgia - In the name of God Amen

I Henry Wyer of the City County and State aforesaid
do make publick and declare this to be my Last Will and
Testament, hereby revoking and declaring Null and
void all and every other Will or Wills heretofore at any
time made by me - First I give devise and bequeath
the whole of my Estate both real and personal property
and effects of every kind and description whatever
and wherever located situated to my beloved wife Mary
Savage Wyer and my two sons Henry Hartstone Wyer
and James Penfield Wyer to be divided between
them in the following manner and proportioning that
is to say, Second To my beloved wife Mary Savage
Wyer I give devise and bequeath the sum of twenty
thousand dollars for and during the term of her natural
life, and after her death to such person or persons as
she may appoint and designate by her Last Will
and Testament or by any instrument in nature of a
Last Will and Testament, and in default of such
appointment then after her death, I give devise and
bequeath the said twenty thousand dollars so given
to my wife for life to my two sons Henry Hartstone
Wyer and James Penfield Wyer equally to be divided
between them share and share alike to them their heirs
executors and administrators forever - Third to my two
sons Henry Hartstone Wyer and James Penfield Wyer
I give devise and bequeath the sum of ~~two~~ ^{one} thousand
dollars to each of them provided my Estate should
be sufficient and amount to that sum after the pay-
ment of twenty thousand dollars as aforesaid bequeathed
to my wife Mary Savage Wyer, but should my Estate
fall short in value of the amount of forty thousand
dollars then and in that case after the payment of
the twenty thousand dollars herein bequeathed to my
wife I give devise and bequeath the balance of my
Estate which may remain after payment of the said
twenty thousand dollars to my two sons Henry Hartstone
Wyer and James Penfield Wyer equally to be divided
between them share and share alike. The first and
second bequeathed in this item of my Will and in the
Residuary Clause to my son Henry Hartstone Wyer
I give devise and bequeath to him for and during
the term of his natural life from, and immediately
after his death to such child or children as he may
leave living at his death, the child or children of any
deceased child of his to take the share its deceased
parent would have been entitled to if in life
Fourth After the payment to my wife of twenty

Thousands dollars and to my sons of ten thousand dollars each making forty thousand dollars as provided for in the second and third items of this my will. Should any residue and surplus of my estate remain, I give devise and bequeath all such residue and surplus to my said wife Mary Savage Wyer my son Henry Hartstone Wyer and my son James Penfield Wyer equally to be divided between them share and share alike. Fifth - I give and bequeath my Gold Watch presented me by the First Baptist Church in Brooklyn in the State of New York to my wife Mary Savage Wyer as a token of my esteem. Sixth - I give and bequeath my books to my son the Revd Henry Hartstone Wyer to him his executors or administrators forever. Lastly I nominate constituents and appoint my friend Charles J. Mills of the City of the City of Savannah Georgia State of Georgia Executor of this my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof Henry Olio Wyer have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of June in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty six - Henry Olio Wyer

This is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid out of the Estate Real and Personal Goods retained to me by my said husband by his last will and testiment after the payment of my just debts give to my beloved brother Charles Brown Henry Six thousand dollars with my blessing for all the love and affection bestowed upon me through my life he has been devoted in his substance when he required it And if ful this is only a small proof of my affection for him he is to have the interest during his lifetime & at his death it is to go to his wife and Sarah Jane Brown but should they both die before him it is at his death to descend back to his Sister Isabella Hunter and Fannie T. Lewis.

To my two Sisters Sarah leave each five thousand dollars they to enjoy the interest and at their death to be divided among their children

To John McLean I request a handsome piece of silver giving him with my love

To Mary and Margaret Henry I request that five hundred each may be sent them with my love to Pascal Blacky and Elizabeth Lamb I desire two hundred and fifty dollars be given them The remainder whether it may be fit to be divided among my children for Matilda Emma Rose & Celia I trust they will not feel this dispensation of my property as a proof of my love it was
