First, I give devise and bequeath unto my nephew William Farley, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, all the property, whether real or personal of which I may die possessed and of what nature or kind soever, the same may be in trust and to, for the only use, benefit and behoof of my daughter Ann Johnston, wife of Mr Alexander Johnston, to the sole, separate and exclusive use, benefit and behoof of the said Ann Johnston, her heirs and assigns forever, or to such person or persons as she by her last Will and Testament, or by any instrument duly executed by her and purporting to be her last Will and Testament may devise or bequeath the same, excepting only my negro Slave called Maria, whom I do hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved grand daughter Ann Farley Johnston, to her own proper use and behoof, and to give, devise or bequeath as she shall see fit; and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my daughter Ann Johnston, of Chatham County, State of Georgia, to be sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have here
