one gilt, also my old mare bet.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my niece
Sarah Latimer one dollar heifer -

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my Brother William
Latimer twenty five dollars in cash to be given
him as he needs it, in two year time

Item 7th I desire and direct that my Executor have
placed over three graves head and foot boards
of marble -

Item 8th I desire and direct that all the balance of
my property, not specified in my will shall be
sold by my Executor -

Item 9th I constitute and appoint my friend
J. A. Lafford Executor to this my last will
and testament. This the 17th day of July 1875

Item 10th I desire and direct that after settling
my property and paying my debts the Surplus
if any shall be legally divided between
my Nephews and Nieces
