charge and limitation whatever to her own proper use
benefit and behoof forever, with full power to dispose
of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper
I also give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Francis, McRounsaville in the same unreserved manner
the Farming utensils used on and belonging to the Farm
on said lots of land, and also all the stock such as Hor-
ses mules hogs cows sheep, that now is on may be upon
the farm at my death, also all money, notes and
accounts, that I may have at my death, also all
vehicles, that I may have at my death, also all Hou-
sehold and Kitchen furniture, all this I give and be-
queath to my beloved daughter Francis McRounsavi-
lle, without limitation or reserve.

the sum of five dollars to be paid in money,
Fifthly, I will and bequeath to my two Grand Children

sum of five dollars each to be paid in money,

John Layton, Executor of this my last will and
