Also ye. I declare my desire that after the death of my beloved wife and the marriage & death of my two named sons to claim to me, Martha J. & Lewis C. Penick that the last will of my lot of land, to be laid off by a line running from North to South which partition and part of said lot by which uniting my son Alexander C. Penick it shall not be liable to his debt in any way or directly out of partition line, and in that case the right hereinafter given in his legal heirs and to them which bear the west part of said lot of land with the three acre more or less on which my house now stands with all its appurtenances together with any of my personal property be sold to the best advantage and proceeds be equally divided between my other son, and son if living if not between them to be left to my son William Penick and his wife. My wife Lewis C. Penick

Then I do further declare my wife and desire that all the money which may become due from the sale of my residence home above after paying my just debts be handed over to my beloved wife to use as she may think best for the benefit and comfort of herself and single children, and furthermore any one of my children accompanying her and care my wife may receive full as in my name as the others still living.

Then I do my will and desire and do hereby appoint my son William C. Penick Executor of this my last will and testament the 20th day of August 1854

I do now seal and declare after dictating and publishing by him self Thomas Penick in his last will and testament in presence of us the subscribers who subscribe our names hereunto in presence of each other this the 11th day of October 1854 the blotted word and intimation done by us and by the testator can stand

shall remain upon my farm now and continue the same so far as the same
may be necessary for example sufficient there to their own proper

she die first and at her death or marriage without that my land and the said
estate be sold and equally divided between my wife and all my children each
having an equal share of the said estate and I include in this provision my
sons who do not live with me to wit William Hobdy Hood Andrew
Corbin Hood and James Carlton Hood. This I desire to have an equal
share of my estate when ever a division of my estate shall be made but I do
not as they are my sons leave them that they shall have no portion of this
estate upon their decease but that they shall add to me and support
themselves as they think best and whatever is made upon the farm over
and above a sufficient for my wife and she it is now mentioned as now
living with her stock to take first care of myself equally divided between
my wife and children when a division may be made (if my wife should be
living) if not then equally divided between the children including my children
who do not live with me.

Item 5. It is to be understood in the 5th Item as giving my wife a child
share & equal portion with each child

Item 6. I will that whatever money I may have on hand at my death be
taken care of by my wife Delilah Hood and kept for my children until the final de-
cision mentioned in the fourth to them and divided as directed.

Item 7. I will that whatever may be due my estate either by sale or account shall be
kept by my wife Delilah Hood for the benefit of my children and divided as directed
by a business among H. John Hood to the my wife has promised set my hands and
date this 1st day March 1851
