and disposing memory do ordain publish and declare the
following to be my last will & Testament

Item 1st After death I wish my body to be
decently interred, and a Christian burial. And my
funeral expences, and the expences of my last illness
to be paid together with all other just claims

Item 2nd I wish my property which consists of
Lot of land known by number Sixtytwo and the
north half (or eighty acres) of Lot Sixty one in
said County, Sixth district and fourth Section
to be sold by my Executrix at private sale if she
should think best and the proceeds to be equally divided
between my legal heirs —

Item 3rd I do not require or wish any inventory
and appraisement whatever of any property, or any
possession of or any public sale thereof unless
such be the wish of my Executrix hereinafter
appointed —

Item 4th I hereby appoint Pherribe J. Bagg
Executrix to carry into effect and execute the
provisions of this my last will and testament
and do not require any personal security
whatever to be given or to be required of
my said Executrix, except in case of its
being made, clearly to appear that said
Executrix has acted with gross negligence or
malfeasance —
