wife, Mary, Lot of Land number Two Hundred and  
three in the Fourteenth district in a fourth Section  
of Chattooga County, whereon I now live containing One  
Hundred Acres of which is Cleared and in Cultivation  
about Thirty Acres, with all the rights, members and  
appurtenances to Said lot of Land in anywise belonging  
free from all Charges whatever, to her own proper use  
benefit and behoof during her life or widowhood.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
in the Same manner the farming tools used on and  
belonging to Said Plantation, with my Horses, Cattle  
and Hogs, together with Household and Kitchen  
furniture.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I will that at the death of my  
beloved wife, that all my property then left  
be equally divided between my three Children
