my executor hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth a certain share of my p
roperty during her natural life or widowhood and if she should marry and
make a partition and in that case it is my will that she should have but five
dollars of my property to be paid her by my executors and the balance of my off
ers to be given to my children or children when the youngest child becomes of age
share & share alike.

Fourthly. I hereby appoint John H. Howie Executor of this my last will's
testament and also Guardian of the person and property of my child or child
ren. It is my desire that my executor attend to my stock gotten and sell my
junk have my crop gathered and sold and apply the proceeds to the support
of my family and the education of my children and when the youngest child
becomes of age to make an equal division as before stated this August 28. 1861
