Georgia Chattooga County } In the name of God amen
I William F Powell of the County of Chattooga State of Georgia being of sound & disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do make & publish this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all Wills by me made at any time and first I commit my Soul to God who gave it and my body to Mother earth and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows—
First I will that all my just debts be paid
Second that I bequeath to my wife Martha A Powell all my estate both Real and Personal with the rights and privileges thereunto belonging to sue and be sued to Plead and be impleaded in all the Courts of law & equity the same as if it were myself during her widowhood with the following exceptions to wit that my son John S Powell is to have one Cow & Calf Bed & Bedstead & furniture and one Silt Hog and Julia S Powell & Sarah E Powell my Daughters are to have one Horse & Saddle each worth one Hundred & forty one Dollars Cow & Calf Bed & Bedstead & furniture & one Silt Hog my son John S Powell having already received his Horse and Saddle, the aforesaid amounts are given to make them equal with my Daughter Mary S McPherson & my son Thomas A Powell which have had the foregoing amounts given to them.
These amounts to be given at their marriage or at the discretion of my wife I furthermore bequeath to my children my Policy in the Cherokee Masonic Mutual Aid Society to be divided equally

among them by my wife—

Third— I furthermore will that in the event my wife Martha A Powell should marry, then my property both real & personal then in her hands be divided equally among her and the children she being an equal heir on at her death, be divided equally between the children— in witness whereof I the said William F Powell to this my will hath set my hand & seal this the fifth day of Feby 1870

I do also choose and appoint W L Landers Executor and manager of said business
