the inferior court sitting as a court of Ordinary of and for said
County, and their successors in office, in the sum and full
sum of one thousand dollars, for the true payment of which to the said Justice as
aforesaid, and their successors in office, we bind ourselves, our heirs executors and
administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents; sealed with our seals,
and dated this first day of May 1848

The condition of the above obligation is such,
that whereas the said Louisa Brewster is the natural Guardian of Patrick W.
Brewster, Orrin W. Brewster, Tomlinson H. Brewster, Harriet Brewster and Lydia
Brewster, Orphans of John Brewster, deceased, and is desirous of demanding
receiving, and disposing of according to law the said orphans distributive share
or shares of in and to the Estate of William Brewster late of Campbell County,
deceased, now, if the said Louisa Brewster do well and truly demean herself as
Guardian as aforesaid, agreeably to law in such case made and provided, Then the
above obligation to be null and void; Else to remain in full force and virtue

Mansell, are held and firmly bound, unto the
Honorable the Justice of the Inferior Court of
said County, sitting for Ordinary purposes, and their successors
in office, in the sum and full value of one thousand dollars, for
the payment of which sum to the said Justice as aforesaid, and their
successors, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators,
jointly, in the whole, and for the whole sum of, jointly, severally,
and firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated
this third day of July, Eighteen hundred and forty eight

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above
bound Samuel J. Mansell, administrators of John Mansell

he shall be thereunto required; and such goods, chattels and credits, do well and truly administer according to Law, and do make a just and true account of his actings and doings, when required by the Superior Court, or Ordinary of said County, and all the rest of the goods, chattels and credits, both real and personal, which shall be found remaining upon the amount of the said administration, the same being first allowed by the Court of Ordinary of said County, shall deliver and pay to such persons, respectively, as are entitled to the same by law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the said decedent, and the same be proved before the Court, and the executors obtain a certificate of the Probate thereof, and the said M. A. Keith do, in such case, if required, render and deliver up the said Letters of administration, then this obligation to be void; else, remain in full force.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that, whereas, the said Samuel M. McCormell has been this day appointed Guardian to Tomlinson F. Brewster, as if the said Samuel M. McCormell do well and truly demean himself as Guardian, as aforesaid, a general and better of Guardian ship, bearing true rule therewith, and according to law, in such case made and provided, the above obligation to be void; otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
