Know all men by these presents that we  
William Carmichael and Amos Brasitton are hold and firmly  
bound unto the Justices of the Inferior Court of said County sitting  
for Ordinary purposes and their Successors in office in the  
Just and full sum of One Thousand Dollars for the payment  
of which sum to the Justices as aforesaid and their Successors  
in office we bind ourselves and their executors and  
administrators in the whole and for the whole sum jointly and  
severally and firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and  
dated this fourth of March 1850.

The condition of the above obligation is such  
that if the above bound William Carmichael administrator  
of the estate real and personal of William Wogedah late of this  
County deceased do make a true and perfect  
inventory of all the estate both real and personal of  
said deceased which have or shall come to the hands  
knowledge or possession of the said William Carmichael  
or unto the hands or possession of any other person or  
persons for him and the same so made do exhibit to the  
said Court of Ordinary when he shall be therunto required  
and such estate do well and truly administer according  
to law and do make a just and true account of his  
actings and doings therein when he shall be therunto required  
by the Court or Judges of said County and at the  
end of the said estate which shall be found remaining  
upon the account of the said administration the same being  
first allowed by the Court shall deliver and pay to  
such persons as persons respectively as are entitled to the  
same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will  
and Testament was made by the deceased and the same  
be proved before the Court and the executor obtaining  
a certificate of the probate thereof and the said William  
Carmichael do in such case (if required) render and  
deliver up the said estate of administration since his election  
to be made unless he can show to the contrary
