

Georgia Cherokee County Know all men by these presents that we Littleby Halcomb and William P. Hammon and George W. Cook are held and jointly bound unto the Honorable Justice of the Superior Court of said County, while sitting for Ordinary purposes and the Successors in office in the sum and full sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars for the payment of which sum to the said Justice as aforesaid and the Successors in office we bind our selves and heirs executors & administrators in the whole and for the whole sum jointly severally and finally by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the 1st September 1854.

The condition of the above obligation is such that - whereas the above bound Littleby Halcomb administrator of the estate of Edward Weston dec'd of this County demand do make a true and perfect inventory of all the estate both real & personal of said deceased which have or shall come into the hands possession or knowledge of the said Littleby Halcomb administrator or into the hands possession of any person or persons for him and the same so made to report into the said Court of Ordinary when he shall be thereto required, and such estate do well and truly administer according to law and do make a just and true account of his actings and doings therein when the said Halcomb shall be therein to required by the Court of Ordinary for said County, and all the debt of said estate which shall be found owing any person or persons or said administrator the same being first allowed by the Court, shall deliver and pay to such person or persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that any loss or fraud was made by the said and the same be repaid to the said and the executor obtain certificates of the Justices of said County that one do in each case if required and determine the Court that this obligation to be paid shall remain in full force.
