Cherokee County } that we Samuel Cook, principle
and Joseph Cook jointly are held
and firmly bound unto the Justice of the Superior Court when
sitting as a court of Ordinary for said County and then sitting
in office, in the full and full sum of One Hundred Dollars
for the payment of which sum to the said Justice and then
successors in office, we bind our selves our heirs executors and administrators
in the whole sum jointly and severally firmly by these present seals
with our seals and dated this 25 January 1858

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the
above bound Samuel Cooks administration of the goods chattels
and credits of Elizabeth Cook late of this County deceased
to make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular
the goods chattels lands & credits of said deceased which have
or shall come to the hands or possession or knowledge of the said
Samuel Cook or into the hands of any other person or persons for
him and the said to make to exhibit unto the said Court of
Ordinary when the shall be thereunto required and such goods chattels
and credits do well and truly administer according to law and
do make a true and just account of this acting and doing
thereon when required by the court or Register of probate for the
deceased and all the rest of the goods chattels & credits which shall
be found remaining on the account of the said administration
the same being first allowed by the said court shall deliver
and pay such moneys respectively as are entitled to the same by law
and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament
was made by the said deceased and the same be proved before the
court and the executor obtains a Certificate of the probate thereof
and the said Samuel Cook do in such case if required render
and deliver up the said letters of administration then this obligation
to be void the bargain in full force
