and family that I should make a disposition of the property
with which a kind providence blessed me with I therefore
make this my last and Testament hereby revoking and annulling
all other wills made by me.

Then first I give and devise to my beloved wife Rachael
during her widowhood or her natural life all the following
to wit 20 1829 and 1830 and 1831 and 1832 and half of 1833
land and being in the second section of the second section
Cherokee County containing 200 acres to have and to hold with
all the rights members and appurtenances to said lot of land
in anywise appertaining or belonging unto me from all
charge or limitation to her own proper use and the Children
of her body that she now has under the age of 21 years
and a last provision is to have a support off of the
said land or till they are fit to marry

Then the said I give and bequeath all of the rest of my
property and effects to my beloved wife Rachael during
her widowhood and the Children that is under the age
of 21 years to have a support until the become of
the age of 21 years or choose to marry under that
age then their little estate to said property This my
last will and Testament this February the 2nd 1832
