firmly, by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated, this
1st day of November 1848

The condition of the above bond is such, that if whereas Mary Scott, late of said County deceased, did by her last will and testament, made the 5th day of September 1848, give and bequeath unto Andrew J. Scott, son of the above bound Charles M. Scott, which son is now a minor, and the said Charles M. Scott, is natural guardian, a certain negro man Sol, about twenty eight years of age, in said will, one Allen J. Woods the printer of paying five hundred dollars to the said Andrew Scott, and keep said Negro within twelve months from the death of said Mary Scott, and whereas the said Mary Scott has since departed this life, the said bequeath, being in force, and whereas the above bound Charles M. Scott, natural guardian as aforesaid of the said Andrew J. Scott is desirous of receiving said Negro man from the executor of said Mary Scott, deceased, to keep in trust for the said Andrew J. Scott according to the tenor of said bequeath, and according to law, in and to the said Andrew J. Scott, as natural guardian as aforesaid of the said Andrew J. Scott, shall faithfully perform said trust; then the above bond to be void, else to remain in full force

Mary Scott's last
Will & Testament

State of Georgia Cherokee County

I Mary Scott of the County and State aforesaid, being in a low state of health,

but of sound mind and memory, knowing

that it is appointed unto man, once to die, and after that the judgement, do resign my body to the earth from whence it came, and my soul to God who gave it, do declare this writing to contain my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others

It is my desire that when I shall depart this life, that my remains be decently interred, in a Christian like manner my grave to be the side of my husband's, at the burying ground at Hickory Flat, mine and my husband's grave be decently

enclosed with stone or other durable material, and have a Tablet of Marble with suitable inscriptions placed over our bodies, and that the expenses of the same, with my last sickness, be paid out of any property not otherwise disposed of in this my last will

Item 2^d

For the love and affection I have and bear to my sister Jane Woods, and to Allen S. Woods, I do hereby bequeath unto them jointly, my residence with the whole of the land attached to the same, being six lots containing forty acres, each, ~~and~~ known as my Home place, together with all the Household and kitchen furniture of every description, and all my Stock of Cattle, ~~Hogs~~, and Sheep and horses to belong to the said Allen S. Woods, with all the provisions of every description, and the farming tools that belong to the farm of the said Jane Woods and Allen S. Woods, to have and enjoy the benefit of said farm and other property during the lifetime of the said Jane Woods, but at her death to become the right and property of Allen S. Woods.

Item 3^d

For the love and affection I have and bear to Andrew J. Scott, son of Charles H. Scott, I do give and bequeath unto him the privilege of paying five hundred dollars to the said Andrew J. Scott, and keep said negro, this privilege to terminate within twelve months from the time of my death

Item 4

I desire that Mr. Asa Carter dispose of the other part of the land and the balance of the negroes and pay all the debts that I may owe and especially the amount that is due Allen S. Woods on the estate of his father and which I have in hand and am bound as guardian to pay after paying all the debts if there should be any left. I desire that it be equally divided between the Brothers and Sisters of my deceased husband and my Brothers and Sisters

Item 5th

I hereby ordain and appoint Levi Rudisill of the County and State of Georgia my executor to this my last will and testament
