1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1848.

The condition of the above bond is such, that if whereas Mary Scott, late of said County deceased, did by her last will and testament, made the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1818., give and bequeath unto Andrew J. Scott, son of the above bound Charles M. Scott, which son is now a minor, and the said Charles M. Scott, is natural guardian, a certain negro man sl., about twenty-eight years of age, living in said will, one Allen of Woods the privilege of paying five hundred dollars to the said Andrew Scott, and keeps said Negro, within twelve months from the death of said Mary Scott; and whereas, the said Mary Scott has since departed this life, the said bequeath being in force, and whereas the above bound Charles M. Scott, natural guardian as aforesaid of the said Andrew J. Scott, is desirous of receiving said Negro man from the executor of said Mary Scott, deceased, to have in trust for the said Andrew J. Scott according to the tenor of said bequeath, and according to law, do witness, Cherokee County Wills, Administrators' Bonds, Guardianships 1848-1854, if www.georgiapioneers.com Charles M. Scott, as natural guardian as aforesaid of the said Andrew J. Scott, shall faithfully perform said trust; then the above bound to be valid, else to remain in full force.

Mary Scott's Last  
Will & Testament

State of Georgia Cherokee County

I Mary Scott of the County and State aforesaid, being in a low state of health, but of sound mind and memory, knowing that it is appointed unto man once to die, and after that the judgment, do resign my soul to the God from whence it came, and my body to God who gave it, and do declare this writing to contain my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others.

It is my desire that when I shall depart this life, that my remains be decently interred in a Christian like manner, my grave to be the side of my husband's, at the burying ground, at Hickory Flat, mine and my husband's grave to be decently

inclosed with stone or other durable material, and have a tablet  
of Marble with suitable inscriptions placed over our bodies, and that  
the expenses of the same, with my last sickness, be paid out of any  
property not otherwise disposed of in this my last will.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> For the love and affection I have and bear to my sister  
Jane Woods, and to Allen S. Woods, I do hereby bequeath unto them  
jointly, my residence with the whole of the land attached to the same, being  
six lots containing forty acres, each, now known as my Home  
place, together with all the Household and kitchen furniture of every  
description, and all my Stock of Cattle, Hogs, and Sheep and  
horses belonging to the said Allen S. Woods, with all the provisions  
of every description, and the farming tools that belongs to the farm  
of the said Jane Woods and Allen S. Woods, to have and enjoy  
the benefit of said farm and other property during the lifetime of  
the said Jane Woods, but at her death to become the rights and  
privileges of Allen S. Woods.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> For the love and affection I have and bear to Andrew J.  
Scott, son of Charles H. Scott, I give and bequeath unto him  
Cherokee County Wills, Administrators' Bonds, Guardianships 1848-1854  
www.georgia-pioneers.com about twenty eight years old, allowing  
to Allen Woods the privilege of paying five hundred dollars to  
the said Andrew J. Scott, and keep said negro, this privilege  
to terminate within twelve months from the time of my death.

Item 4 I desire that my executors dispose of the other part of the land  
and the balance of the negroes and pay all the debts that  
I may owe and especially the amount that is due Allen S.  
Woods on the estate of his Father and which I have in hand  
and any bound as guardian to pay after paying all the debts  
if there should be any left, I desire that it be equally divided  
between the Brothers and Sisters of my deceased husband and  
my Brothers and Sisters.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I hereby ordain and appoint Levi Ruckbill of the County and State  
aforesaid, my executor to this my last will and testament

The condition of the above obligation, is such, that whereas the said Green Griffin hath this day been appointed Guardian to Mary Griffin, Sarah Griffin, George Griffin & Adeline Griffin Orphans of Rett J. Griffin deceased; Now if Cherokee County Wills, Administrators' Bonds, Guardianships, 1848-1854 the www.georgiapioneers.com and truly demean himself as Guardian as aforesaid agreeable to letter of Guardianship bearing even date herewith, and agreeable to law in such case made and provided the above obligation to be null and void, otherwise to be in full force and effect.
