In the name of God Amen
 I, Richard Neal being afflicted
 and not knowing but kind
 affliction may soon follow I feel and right both as respects
 myself and family that I should make a distribution of the property
 of which a kind providence has blessed me with do therefore make
 this my last will and testament

1st I give and devise that my body be buried in decent
 Christian like manner and my soul I resign to God who gave it
 2nd I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
 Jane, my plantation wherein I now live containing thirty acres in
 Culloden and being on Lots numbers four hundred and fifty one
 (451) four hundred and fourteen (414) in the second district and
 second section of said County containing forty acres each lot more
 or less unto her for and during her natural life or widowhood
 after which that is if she does proper to marry I direct that said
 premises be sold and divided between her and my four Children
 James, Richard, John Wiley, and Oliver. I give Horatio my wife
 having an equal share with my said four Children and if she remain
 a widow until death then the above named property to be divided
 as also directed to be given my four Children I do direct and
 bequeath unto my wife Mary Jane, one iron gray filly two years old
 last spring for her use and benefit also one Cow and calf and
 one heifer yearling, also my flock of sheep I direct and give unto
 my wife and Children for their use also three hundred and
 above my household kitchen furniture. I give unto my wife Mary
 Jane, during her life or widowhood if she marry, to be sold and
 divided as I have directed my plantation the hiring a child
 share unto herself, my plantation tools to remain for the
 use of my family, I also give twelve of pork to my family also
 the crop of crop corn & fodder, shucks oats wheat potatoes
 I also direct that my other property two lots of Land and being
 a being in said County and situated thereon by No 1 five hundred
 and twenty five (225) and five hundred and twenty four (224)
 be given me and of cattle my crop of cotton the balance
 of my goods to be sold to the best advantage and the money
 that the said property may bring I direct that my just
 debts be immediately paid out of the same and the balance
 to be divided out for the use of my four Children then
 named and the interest of the said money or what may be
 appended to educating my four Children and also what
 other money I may be possessed of as the same

or applied as I have directed with my other money after my
last debts are paid

4th Item. I hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary Jane to be my
executrix and James H. Darrell my executor to do and act out this
my will and testament the 24th day of November 1851
