

In the name of God Alme I Stephen Bates of the State of Georgia and County of Cherokee being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling me to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament > that is to say principally and first of all I give and bequeath my soul to God into the hands of almighty God that gave it, and my body according to the Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall remain the same by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form first I give and bequeath to Sam: my dearly beloved wife all my house hold and kitchen furniture after what land I possess during his natural life then after her death to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided among my son William and George will have no less man for her own use and all my other what hogs I have at home and also what wheat I have made and the grainy crop that there is stored on the land and also my other property to be sold to the highest bidder on as Justice masters credit and as my son George V Bates has not had an equal share with the rest of my slaves it is my will that he should have forty of the process of the sale then after my just debts are paid the balance to be equally divided amongst my ten children & also against my sons William V Bates and George V Bates my certain executors to see that this my will is executed

in the year of our Lord one thousand  
Eighty One and fifty and forty and  
signed sealed and published
