 Griffin has this day been appointed Guardian to Mary Griffin, Sarah Griffin,
 George Griffin & Adeline Griffin orphans of Rebb J. Griffin deceased: Now if
 the said Green Griffin does well and duly discharge his duties as Guardian as
 aforesaid agreeable to laws of Guardianship bearing even date herewith, and
 agreeable to law in such case made and provided the above obligation to be
 null and void, otherwise to be in full force and effect

 and testament in manner following
 that is to say;

1st I give my soul and body to God my Creator.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Letitia Hunt (Deceased) 2nd of
 land (No 1221) twelve hundred & twenty one, and eleven hundred
 and forty eight (1848) all in the fifteenth District & second section

of Cherokee County Ga. To have and To hold her life time, and at her death to be equally divided, between my beloved sons and daughters: To wit, Greenbury Hunt and Elizabeth Jane the wife of Ephraim B. Sergeant, I will and bequeath unto my beloved son Greenbury Hunt the following lots of land; To wit, No. 1222) twelve hundred and twenty two and (1227) twelve hundred and twenty seven and (1149) Eleven hundred and forty nine and (1150) Eleven hundred and fifty, all in the fifteenth District and second section, of the State and County, aforesaid

I will and bequeath unto my son in law Ephraim B. Sergeant the following lots of land; To wit, 1220. Twelve hundred and twenty and (1228) Twelve hundred and twenty Eight and (1151) Eleven hundred and fifty Seven all in the fifteenth District and second section, of the State and County aforesaid I do further will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Letitia Hunt, all of my Corn, fodder, oats and callinging hogs and wheat for her support

I do will and bequeath all my personal property, together with the ready money now in and my beloved wife and son and son in law, to wit, Letitia Hunt + Greenbury Hunt and Ephraim B. Sergeant, to be Equally divided between them after paying my last debts and burial and funeral expenses and if they cannot make a divide among themselves, to see the personal property and divide the money equally between them and I hereby make Letitia Hunt, Greenbury Hunt and Ephraim B. Sergeant, Executors and executors of this my last will and Testament
