Evans security are here and firmly bound unto the Ordinary of said County and his successors in office in the full sum of twenty five hundred dollars for the true payment of which sum to the said Ordinary and his successors in office we bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators in the whole and for the whole sum jointly and severally and firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 4th day of October eighteen hundred and fifty two - The consideration of the above obligation is such that if the above bound William Mc Bell Administrator of the estate and chattels & effects of William Bell late of said County do and do make a true and perfect inventory of all and sundry the goods chattels and effects which he or shall come to the hands or knowledge of the said William Mc Bell or into the hands or possession of any person or persons for him; and do the same to make do exhibit to the Court of ordinary when he shall be summoned required and such goods chattels and effects do well and truly administer according to law and do make a just and true account of his doings

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and doings thereof then required by the Superior Court or ordinary of said County and all the rest of the goods chattels and credits both real and personal which shall be found remaining upon the account of said administration the same being first allowed by the Court of Ordinary of said County and shall deliver and pay to such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and Testament was made by the said deceased and the same be proved before the Court and the executors obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof and the said William Mc. Bell do in such case if required under and deliver up the said Letter of administration then this obligation to be void else remain in full force

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the said James Tippers has this day been appointed Guardian to Milly Johnson & Martha Johnson orphans of Isaac Johnson deceased now if the said James Tippers do well and truly discharge himself as Guardian as of record agreeable to the terms of said Guardian his having even date herewith and agreeable to Law in such case made and provided that the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue Signed sealed and acknowledged in open Court James Jordan ordinary
